A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CYBERBULLYING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that across the country, 2 states are grappling with escalating instances of cyberbullying and their often tragic results. Currently, twenty-five states 3 4 have passed laws against cyberbullying, and most states direct 5 local school districts on how to deal with cyberbullying -6 ranging from training personnel to disciplining students. 7 The department of education and board of education have 8 both rules and policies governing cyberbullying. Legislation 9 was passed in 2011 to require the monitoring and enforcement of 10 these policies, however concerns were raised that this

4	SECTION 2. Chapter 711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
5	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
6	and to read as follows:		
7	" <u>§711-</u>	Harassment by cyberbullying. (1) A person	
8	commits the offense of harassment by cyberbullying if with the		
9	intent to harass, annoy, or alarm another person, or in reckless		
10	disregard of the risk thereof, that person:		
11	<u>(a) (i)</u>	Posts a message or statement in a public media	
12		forum about any other person;	
13	<u>(ii)</u>	Knows that the message or statement is false or	
14		intentionally misleading; and	
15	<u>(iii)</u>	Authors a message or statement that a reasonable	
16		person would believe to be damaging to the	
17		character or reputation of the other person; or	
18	<u>(b)</u> <u>(i)</u>	Transmits a message or statement by means of	
19		electronic communication to other persons about	
20		another person;	
21	<u>(ii)</u>	Knows that the message or statement is false or	
22		intentionally misleading; and	

1	(iii) Authors a message or statement that a reasonable		
2	person would believe to be damaging to the		
3	character or reputation of the other person.		
4	(2) As used in this section:		
5	"Electronic communication" means any transfer of signs,		
6	signals, writing, images, sounds, data, or intelligence of any		
7	nature transmitted in whole or part by a wire, radio,		
8	electromagnetic, photoelectronic, or photo-optical system.		
9	"Public media forum" means the Internet or any other medium		
10	designed or intended to be used to convey information to other		
11	individuals, regardless of whether a membership or password is		
12	required to view the information, and includes but is not		
13	limited to social media networks and blogs.		
14	(3) Harassment by cyberbullying is a class C felony."		
15	SECTION 3. Section 708-893, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
16	amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:		
17	"(1) A person commits the offense of use of a computer in		
18	the commission of a separate crime if the person:		
19	(a) Intentionally uses a computer to obtain control over		
20	the property of the victim to commit theft in the		
21	first or second degree; or		

1	(b) Kno	owingly uses a computer to identify, select,
2	so	licit, persuade, coerce, entice, induce, or procure
3	the	e victim or intended victim of the following
4	of	fenses:
5	(i)	Section 707-726, relating to custodial
6		interference in the first degree;
7	(ii)	Section 707-727, relating to custodial
8		interference in the second degree;
9	(iii)	Section 707-731, relating to sexual assault in
10		the second degree;
11	(iv)	Section 707-732, relating to sexual assault in
12		the third degree;
13	(v)	Section 707-733, relating to sexual assault in
14		the fourth degree;
15	(vi)	Section 707-751, relating to promoting child
16		abuse in the second degree; [or]
17	(vii)	Section 711- , relating to harassment by
18		cyberbullying; or
19	[(vii)]	(viii) Section 712-1215, relating to promoting
20		pornography for minors."
21	SECTION	4. The provisions of this Act shall be liberally
22	construed to	give effect to the purposes thereof.

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- 1 SECTION 5. Nothing in this Act is intended to interfere
- 2 with the First Amendment rights of free speech and expression of
- 3 any person affected.
- 4 SECTION 6. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 5 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
- 6 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 7 applications of the Act, which can be given effect without the
- 8 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 9 of this Act are severable.
- 10 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
