## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that while the candidate
2	advisory council for the board of regents of the University of
3	Hawaii has fielded many outstanding appointees to the board,
4	substantive concerns have been raised as to the selection
5	process. Since the passage of Act 56, Session Laws of Hawaii
6	2007, to implement the amendments to article X, section 6 of the
7	Hawaii State Constitution, the legislature is aware of a number
8	of issues resulting from the new method of regent selection,
9	which has hampered the work of the regents candidate advisory
10	council and led to questions regarding the final selection of
11	appointees during the Senate confirmation process.
12	Especially on the heels of the 2011 board of education
13	appointment process, the legislature can clearly see the
14	potential value in granting the governor the authority to select
15	and appoint regents on the basis of how each regent's individual
16	strengths will add to and complement the overall board of
17	regents. It has become evidently clear that no governor will be

able to adequately select nominees to the board of regents

- 1 unless the governor has more control and involvement in the
- 2 recruitment and selection process. The legislature believes
- 3 that the time has come to reassess and seriously consider making
- significant changes to the form and function of the regents 4
- candidate advisory council. 5
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to reconstitute the form and
- 7 processes of the candidate advisory council to maximize the
- 8 governor's ability to appoint qualified and able individuals to
- 9 serve as members of the board of regents and effectively lead
- 10 the University of Hawaii.
- SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11
- 12 amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
- 13 designated and to read as follows:
- 14 "§304A-Candidate advisory council for the board of
- regents of the University of Hawaii. (a) The candidate 15
- 16 advisory council for the board of regents of the University of
- Hawaii shall recruit, rate, and present pools of at least three 17
- 18 qualified candidates to the governor whenever an appointment to
- 19 the board of regents needs to be made. The candidate advisory
- 20 council shall be placed in the office of the governor for
- 21 administrative purposes.
- 22 The candidate advisory council shall:

1	(1) Thirty days of a vacancy; or
2	(2) At least one hundred twenty days prior to the
3	expiration of a term.
4	(d) In order to provide continuity for the board of
5	regents, the governor may recommend to the candidate advisory
6	council the reappointment of board of regents members, subject
7	to senate confirmation.
8	(e) The candidate advisory council shall consist of five
9	members to be appointed by the governor without regard to
10	section 26-34, and one non-voting ex officio member who shall be
11	the most recent emeritus chair of the board of regents.
12	Appointees to the candidate advisory council shall have a
13	general understanding of the purposes of higher education, the
14	mission and strategic goals of the University of Hawaii system,
15	and the role and responsibilities of the board of regents.
16	Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed as having
17	placed the broad public interest ahead of special interests,
18	have achieved a high level of prominence, are respected by the
19	community, and are best qualified to thoroughly recruit and rate
20	candidates for the governor's consideration.
21	(f) Members of the candidate advisory council shall serve
22	for the duration of the term of the governor who appointed them.

- (g) The candidate advisory council shall operate in a 1 2 wholly nonpartisan manner. No member of the candidate advisory council shall run for or hold any elected office of the State, 3 or its political subdivisions. Any member of the candidate 4 advisory council who decides to run for an elected office of the 5 6 State, or its political subdivisions, shall resign from the 7 candidate advisory council prior to filing nomination papers. (h) The governor shall appoint a chairperson. A majority 8 of the members to which the candidate advisory council is 9 10 entitled shall constitute a quorum to do business. The concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the 11 candidate advisory council is entitled shall be necessary to 12 make any action of the candidate advisory council valid. 13 14 (i) Members of the candidate advisory council shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, 15 including travel, board, and lodging expenses, necessary for the 16 performance of their duties." 17 SECTION 3. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 19 amended to read as follows: "§304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications; 20 meetings. (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the 21 22 general management and control of the board of regents

The board shall consist of fifteen members who 1 shall be appointed [and] by the governor from pools of qualified 2 candidates presented to the governor by the candidate advisory 3 council for the board of regents of the University of Hawaii and 4 confirmed by the Senate; provided that if the pool of qualified 5 candidates drops below three at any time during the nomination 6 and confirmation process, the governor may request that the 7 8 candidate advisory council reopen recruitment for qualified candidates. Members may be removed by the governor. Except as 9 otherwise provided by law, state officers shall be eligible for 10 appointment and membership. The term of each member shall be 11 five years, except as provided for the initial appointment in 12 section 26-11; provided that the term of the student member 13 shall be two years. Every member may serve beyond the 14 expiration date of the member's term of appointment until the **15**. member's successor has been appointed by the governor and 16 confirmed by the senate in accordance with article X, section 6 17 of the Hawaii constitution. - 1 years, the senate shall consider the question of whether to
- 2 reconfirm the member at least one hundred twenty days prior to
- 3 the conclusion of a member's first five-year term; provided that
- 4 if the senate is not in session within one hundred twenty days
- 5 prior to the conclusion of the member's first five-year term,
- 6 the member shall continue to serve until the senate convenes for
- 7 the next regular session or the next special session for which
- 8 the senate is authorized to consider the question of
- 9 reconfirmation.
- 10 (b) In determining whether to confirm the governor's
- 11 nominees to the board of regents, the senate shall consider the
- 12 combination of abilities, breadth of experiences, and
- 13 characteristics of the board of regents, as a whole, that will
- 14 best serve the diverse interests and needs of the students of
- 15 the university system and further assist the university system
- 16 in achieving its strategic goals and performance indicators.
- 17 Such considerations shall include but not be limited to
- 18 reflecting the diversity of the student population, geographical
- 19 representation, and a broad representation of higher education-
- 20 related stakeholders.
- 21  $\left[\frac{b}{a}\right]$  (c) At a meeting preceding July 1 of each year, the
- 22 board of regents shall elect a chairperson and up to two vice-



- 1 chairpersons whose terms shall be from July 1 to June 30 of the
- 2 next year or thereafter until their successors are elected. The
- 3 board shall appoint a secretary, who shall not be a member of
- 4 the board. The president of the university shall act as
- 5 executive officer of the board. A majority of the board of
- 6 regents shall constitute a quorum to conduct business, and the
- 7 concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the board
- 8 of regents is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of
- 9 the board of regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten
- 10 times annually and, from time to time, may meet in each of the
- 11 counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.
- 12 [<del>(c)</del>] (d) The governor shall notify the [regents]
- 13 candidate advisory council for the board of regents of the
- 14 University of Hawaii in writing within ten days of receiving
- 15 notification that a member of the board of regents is resigning,
- 16 has died, or is being removed by the governor.

- 18 without pay but shall be entitled to their travel expenses
- 19 within the State when attending meetings of the board or when
- 20 actually engaged in business relating to the work of the board."
- 21 SECTION 4. Section 304A-104.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 22 repealed.

- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
