A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CODE OF ETHICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Policy makers, state agency leaders, candidates		
2	for state elective offices, and state board and commission		
3	members are required every year to file financial disclosure		
4	statements to the state ethics commission. However, only the		
5	financial disclosure statements of the governor, lieutenant		
6	governor, legislators, and state department directors and their		
7	deputies are public records and available for inspection and		
8	duplication. Thus, the financial disclosure statements of		
9	members who serve on state boards and commissions are not		
10	considered public documents despite some board or commission		
11	members holding discretionary authority to approve projects or		
12	issue permits or licenses that may impact state government,		
13	business, and economy. This type of authority may pose		
14	conflicts of interest, of which the public may be unaware.		
15	The purpose of this Act is to further ensure transparency		
16	and accountability of individuals serving in state government by		
17	making the financial disclosure statements of state board and

- 3 SECTION 2. Section 84-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 5 "(d) The financial disclosure statements of the following
- 6 persons shall be public records and available for inspection and
- 7 duplication:
- 8 (1) The governor, the lieutenant governor, the members of
- 9 the legislature, candidates for and delegates to the
- 10 constitutional convention, the trustees of the office
- of Hawaiian affairs, and candidates for state elective
- 12 offices:
- 13 (2) The directors of the state departments and their
- 14 deputies, regardless of the titles by which the
- foregoing persons are designated; provided that with
- respect to the department of the attorney general, the
- foregoing shall apply only to the attorney general and
- the first deputy attorney general;
- 19 (3) The administrative director of the State;
- 20 (4) The president, the vice presidents, the assistant vice
- 21 presidents, the chancellors, and the provosts of the
- University of Hawaii;
