A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HOMELESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that according to a 2010
- 2 report, some 13,886 adults and children in Hawaii experienced
- 3 homelessness. This represents a three per cent increase from a
- 4 year ago.
- 5 The legislature further finds that in its first large-scale
- 6 application of a new ordinance barring people from storing
- 7 tents, furniture, clothing, and other personal items in public
- 8 areas, city and county of Honolulu officials have issued written
- 9 notices to numerous homeless individuals and families. This
- 10 leaves many homeless people with no choice but to comply, and
- 11 many do not know where to go next.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to require counties to inform
- 13 homeless individuals and families of temporary emergency shelter
- 14 options if removed from public property.
- 15 SECTION 2. Section 346-375, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- 17 "[+]346-375[<math>+] Temporary emergency shelter. (a) In
- 18 addition to any other duties prescribed by law, the department



- 1 shall develop, in consultation with the four counties, a
- 2 procedure for identifying locations that shall be used for
- 3 temporary emergency shelters for homeless individuals and
- 4 families. The department shall actively partner with and
- 5 monitor the efforts of the counties.
- 6 (b) Each county shall be responsible for partnering with
- 7 nonprofit organizations to locate, designate, and maintain the
- 8 areas that shall be used for temporary emergency shelters. The
- 9 designated locations may include private, county, state, and
- 10 federal lands.
- 11 (c) Each county shall be responsible for partnering with
- 12 nonprofit organizations to provide information on and access to
- 13 temporary emergency shelters if the county relocates homeless
- 14 individuals and families from public property."
- 15 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
