## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROSTITUTION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to authorize a
- 2 person convicted of committing the offense of prostitution to
- 3 file a motion to vacate the judgment under certain circumstances
- 4 and to establish procedures for the motion to vacate.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 712, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 7 and to read as follows:
- 8 "§712- Prostitution; motion to vacate judgment. (1) A
- 9 person convicted of committing the offense of prostitution under
- 10 section 712-1200, loitering for the purpose of engaging in or
- 11 advancing prostitution under section 712-1206, street
- 12 solicitation of prostitution in designated areas under section
- 13 712-1207, or convicted of a lesser offense when originally
- 14 charged with a violation of section 712-1200, 712-1206, or
- 15 712-1207, may file a motion to vacate the conviction if the
- 16 defendant's participation in the offense was the result of the
- 17 person having been a victim of:

1	<u>(a)</u>	Promoting prostitution in the first degree under	
2		section 712-1202; or	
3	<u>(b)</u>	A severe form of trafficking as defined in title 22	
4		United States Code section 7102(13).	
5	(2)	A motion filed under this section shall:	
6	<u>(a)</u>	Be in writing;	
7	<u>(b)</u>	Be made within a reasonable period of time after the	
8		person ceases to be a victim as described in	
9		subsection (1), subject to reasonable concerns for the	
10		safety of the defendant, family members of the	
11		defendant, or other victims of the trafficking that	
12		may be jeopardized by the bringing of a motion, or for	
13		other reasons consistent with the purpose of this	
14		section; and	
15	<u>(c)</u>	Describe the evidence and provide copies of any	
16		official documents showing that the defendant is	
17		entitled to relief under this section.	
18	(3)	The court shall hold a hearing on a motion filed under	
19	this sect	ion if the motion satisfies the requirements of	
20	subsection (2); provided that the court may dismiss a motion		
21	without a hearing if the court finds that the motion fails to		
22	assert grounds on which relief may be granted.

(4) Official documentation of the defendant's status as a 1 2 victim of trafficking or a victim of a severe form of trafficking from a federal, state, or local law enforcement 3 agency shall create a presumption that the person's 4 participation in the offense of prostitution was a result of 5 6 having been a victim of trafficking or a victim of a severe form 7 of trafficking, but shall not be required for granting a 8 petition under this subsection. 9 (5) If the court grants a motion filed under this section, **10** the court shall vacate the conviction and dismiss the accusatory 11 pleading. (6) A person making a motion to vacate pursuant to this **12** section has the burden of proof by a preponderance of the 13 14 evidence. This section shall not apply to a motion to vacate a 15 16 conviction under this chapter for: Promoting prostitution; or 17 (a) A person who offers a fee to engage in sexual conduct 18 (b) 19 with another person.

(8) For the purposes of this section:

- 1 "Official documentation" includes a police report, court
- 2 record, or affidavit generated from a federal, state, or local
- 3 law enforcement agency.
- 4 "Victim of trafficking" and "victim of a severe form of
- 5 trafficking" shall have the same meaning as in title 22 United
- 6 States Code section 7102."
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
