A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIMITATION OF ACTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 657, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designate	d and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§65</u>	7- Civil action arising from sexual offenses;
5	applicati	on; certificate of merit. (a) Notwithstanding any law
6	to the co	ntrary, an action for recovery of damages based on
7	physical,	psychological, or other injury or condition suffered
8	by a mino	r arising from the sexual abuse of the minor by any
9	person ma	y be commenced against the person who committed the act
10	of sexual	abuse. The time for commencement of the action shall
11	be within	<u>:</u>
12	(1)	Eight years of the date the plaintiff or the person
13		who committed the act of sexual abuse attains the age
14		of majority, whichever occurs later; or
15	(2)	Three years of the date the plaintiff discovers or
16		reasonably should have discovered that psychological
17		injury or illness occurring after the age of majority
18		was caused by the sexual abuse.

1	A ci	vil cause of action for sexual abuse of a minor shall
2	be based	upon sexual acts that constituted or would have
3	constitut	ed a criminal offense under part V or VI of chapter
4	707.	
5	(b)	For a period of two years following the effective date
6	of this A	ct, a victim of child sexual abuse that occurred in
7	this Stat	e who has been barred from filing a claim against the
8	victim's	abuser due to the expiration of the applicable civil
9	statute o	f limitations that was in effect prior to the effective
10	date of t	his Act may file a claim in the circuit courts of this
11	State aga	inst the person who committed the act of sexual abuse.
12	A cl	aim may also be brought under this subsection against a
13	legal ent	ity, except the State, if:
14	(1)	The person committing the act of sexual abuse against
15		the minor was employed by an institution, agency,
16		firm, business, corporation, or other public or
17		private legal entity that owed a duty of care to the
18		victim; or
19	(2)	The person who committed the act of sexual abuse and
20		the minor were engaged in an activity over which the
21		legal entity had a degree of responsibility or
22		control.



1	Damages against the legal entity shall be awarded under		
2	this subsection only if there is a finding of gross negligence		
3	on the part of the legal entity.		
4	(c) A defendant against whom a civil action is commenced		
5	may recover attorney's fees if the court determines that a false		
6	accusation was made with no basis in fact and with malicious		
7	intent. A verdict in favor of the defendant shall not be the		
8	sole basis for a determination that an accusation had no basis		
9	in fact and was made with malicious intent. The court shall		
10	make an independent finding of an improper motive prior to		
11	awarding attorney's fees under this section.		
12	(d) In any civil action filed pursuant to subsection (a)		
13	or (b), a certificate of merit shall be filed by the attorney		
14	for the plaintiff, and shall be sealed and remain confidential.		
15	The certificate of merit shall include a notarized statement by		
16	<u>a:</u>		
17	(1) Psychologist licensed pursuant to chapter 465;		
18	(2) Marriage and family therapist licensed pursuant to		
19	chapter 451J;		
20	(3) Mental health counselor licensed pursuant to chapter		
21	453D; or		

1	(4) Clinical social worker licensed pursuant to chapter
2	467E;
3	who is knowledgeable in the relevant facts and issues involved
4	in the action and who is not a party to the action.
5	The notarized statement included in the certificate of
6	merit shall set forth in reasonable detail the facts and
7	opinions relied upon to conclude that there is a reasonable
8	basis to believe that the plaintiff was subject to one or more
9	acts that would constitute an offense listed in subsection (a).
10	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Limitation of Actions; Sexual Offenses Against Minors

Description:

Extends the statute of limitations for civil actions brought by persons subjected to sexual offenses as a minor against the person who committed the act. Revives for a two-year period certain actions for which the statute of limitations had previously lapsed. Authorizes a court to award attorney's fees to a defendant when a accusation of sexual abuse was made with no basis in fact and with malicious intent. (SD1)
