RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 134-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$134-8 Ownership, etc., of automatic firearms, silencers, 4 etc., prohibited; penalties. (a) The manufacture, possession, 5 sale, barter, trade, gift, transfer, or acquisition of any of 6 the following is prohibited: assault pistols, except as 7 provided by section 134-4(e); automatic firearms; rifles with barrel lengths less than sixteen inches; shotguns with barrel 8 9 lengths less than eighteen inches; cannons; mufflers, silencers, or devices for deadening or muffling the sound of discharged 10 firearms; hand grenades, dynamite, blasting caps, bombs, or 11 12 bombshells, or other explosives; or any type of ammunition or any projectile component thereof coated with teflon or any other 13 14 similar coating designed primarily to enhance its capability to penetrate metal or pierce protective armor; and any type of 15 ammunition or any projectile component thereof designed or 16

intended to explode or segment upon impact with its target.
