A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII BOARD OF REGENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 304A-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$304A-104 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications; 4 (a) The affairs of the university shall be under the 5 general management and control of the board of regents consisting of fifteen members who shall be appointed and may be 7 removed by the governor. Except as otherwise provided by law, 8 state officers shall be eligible for appointment and membership. 9 The term of each member shall be five years, except as provided 10 for the initial appointment in section 26-11; provided that the 11 term of the student member shall be two years. Every member may 12 serve beyond the expiration date of the member's term of 13 appointment until the member's successor has been appointed by 14 the governor and confirmed by the senate in accordance with 15 article X, section 6 of the Hawaii constitution. Members shall 16 serve no more than two consecutive five-year terms; provided 17 that the members who are initially appointed to terms of two 18 years or less pursuant to section 26-11(a) may be reappointed to

- 1 two ensuing five-year terms. If a member is to be appointed to
- 2 a second term of five years, the senate shall consider the
- 3 question of whether to reconfirm the member at least one hundred
- 4 twenty days prior to the conclusion of a member's first five-
- 5 year term; provided that if the senate is not in session within
- 6 one hundred twenty days prior to the conclusion of the member's
- 7 first five-year term, the member shall continue to serve until
- 8 the senate convenes for the next regular session or the next
- 9 special session for which the senate is authorized to consider
- 10 the question of reconfirmation.
- 11 (b) At a meeting preceding July 1 of each year, the board
- 12 of regents shall elect a chairperson and up to two vice-
- 13 chairpersons whose terms shall be from July 1 to June 30 of the
- 14 next year or thereafter until their successors are elected. The
- 15 board shall appoint a secretary, who shall not be a member of
- 16 the board. The president of the university shall act as
- 17 executive officer of the board. A majority of the board of
- 18 regents shall constitute a quorum to conduct business, and the
- 19 concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the board
- 20 of regents is entitled shall be necessary to make any action of
- 21 the board of regents valid. The board shall meet at least ten

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    times annually and, from time to time, may meet in each of the
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    counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.
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          [(c) The governor shall notify the regents candidate
    advisory council in writing within ten days of receiving
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    notification that a member of the board of regents is resigning,
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    has died, or is being removed by the governor.
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         (d) (c) The members of the board of regents shall serve
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    without pay but shall be entitled to their travel expenses
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    within the State when attending meetings of the board or when
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    actually engaged in business relating to the work of the board."
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         SECTION 2. Section 304A-104.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    repealed.
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         ["§304A-104.5 Regents candidate advisory council for the
    board of regents of the University of Hawaii. (a) There is
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    established the regents candidate advisory council for the board
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    of regents of the University of Hawaii to present to the
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    governor pools of qualified candidates from which the members of
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    the board of regents shall be nominated and, by and with the
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    consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. The regents
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    candidate advisory council shall establish the criteria for
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    qualifying, screening, and presenting to the governor candidates
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    for membership on the board of regents. The regents candidate
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1	advisory	council shall be attached to the University of Hawaii
2	for admin	istrative purposes.
3	(b)	Except as provided in subsection (c), the regents
4	candidate	advisory council shall present no fewer than two and
5	no more t	han four qualified candidates for each seat on the
6	board of	regents to the governor within:
7	(1)	Sixty days of a vacancy that arises by resignation,
8		death, or removal by the governor; or
9	(2)	One hundred twenty days prior to the expiration of a
10		term.
11	The regen	ts candidate advisory council shall be deemed to have
12	fulfilled	its obligation under this section upon presentation of
13	the names	of the minimum number of candidates required to be
14	presented	for each seat or seats on the board of regents.
15	(c)	When there are multiple seats vacant within the same
16	county or	within the at large membership, the regents candidate
17	advisory	council shall present candidates for seats on the board
18	of regent	s to the governor as follows:
19	(1)	For two seats from the same county or two at large
20		seats, no fewer than four and no more than six
21		candidates;

1	(2)	For three seats from the same county, no fewer than
2		five and no more than eight candidates; and
3	(3)	For more than three seats, the regents candidate
4		advisory council shall determine appropriate minimum
5		numbers of candidates, which shall provide for at
6		least three candidates for the final seat, and maximum
7		numbers of candidates.
8	(d)	In making its presentations, the regents candidate
9	advisory	council shall:
10	(1)	Develop a statement that includes the selection
11		criteria to be applied and a description of the
12		responsibilities and duties of a member of the board
13		of regents and distribute this statement to potential
14		candidates;
15	(2)	Screen and qualify candidates for each position on the
16		board of regents based on their background,
17		experience, and potential for discharging the
18		responsibilities of a member of the board of regents;
19	(3)	Publicly advertise pending vacancies and actively
20		solicit and accept applications from potential
21		candidates;

1	-(4)	Deve	lop and implement a fair, independent, and
2		nonp	artisan procedure for selecting candidates to
3		serv	e on the board of regents;
4	(5)	Ensu	re student involvement by establishing a student
5		advi	sory group composed of:
6		(A) -	The senior student affairs officer of the
7			University of Hawaii system;
8		(B)	No fewer than three student representatives from
9			the University of Hawaii student caucus who shall
10			represent, to the maximum extent possible, the
11			interests of the various University of Hawaii
12			campuses on each island; and
13		(C)	No fewer than three student life advisors who
14			shall represent, to the maximum extent possible,
15			the interests of the various University of Hawaii
16			campuses on each island,
17		who-	shall work with and assist the regents candidate
18		advi	sory council to recruit and evaluate candidates
19		for	the student member of the board of regents and
20		make	recommendations to the regents candidate advisory
21		coun	cil based on the qualifications of the candidates
22		appl	ying for the position; and

1	(6)	Require each candidate to disclose any existing or
2		anticipated contracts with the University of Hawaii or
3		any existing or anticipated financial transactions
4		with the University of Hawaii.
5	Upon sub m	rission of the names of candidates to the governor, the
6	regents c	andidate advisory council shall make available the
7	names of	candidates to the public through the University of
8	Hawaii.	
9	(e)	For each board seat to be filled, the governor shall
10	select on	e nominee from among the candidates submitted by the
11	regents c	andidate advisory council.
12	(f)	The regents candidate advisory council shall consist
13	of seven	members to be appointed without regard to section 26-34
14	as follow	r s :
15	(1)	One member shall be appointed by the president of the
16		senate;
17	(2)	One member shall be appointed by the speaker of the
18		house of representatives;
19	(3)	One member shall be appointed by the governor;
20	-(4)	One member shall be appointed by one of the co chairs
21		of the All Campus Council of Faculty Senate Chairs of
22	•	the University of Hawaii. A person may not be

1		appointed as a member of the regents candidate
2		advisory council under this paragraph, if within the
3		five years immediately preceding that appointment, the
4		person served on the All Campus Council of Faculty
5		Senate Chairs of the University of Hawaii;
6	(5)	One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of
7		the Executive Council of the University of Hawaii
8		Student Caucus. A person may not be appointed as a
9		member of the regents candidate advisory council under
10		this paragraph, if within one year immediately
11		preceding that appointment, the person served on the
12		Executive Council of the University of Hawaii Student
13		Caucus;
14	-(6)-	One member shall be appointed by the chairperson of
15		the Association of Emeritus Regents; and
16	(7)	One member shall be appointed by the president of the
17		University of Hawaii Alumni Association;
18	provided	that members appointed under paragraphs (4) to (7)
19	shall be	selected from the general public and may include
20	members o	f the constituencies represented; provided further that
21	each appo	intee satisfies the requirements for appointment
22	provided	in this subsection.
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1	The regents candidate advisory council shall be selected in
.2	a wholly nonpartisan manner. Appointees to the regents
3	candidate advisory council shall have a general understanding of
4	the purposes of higher education, the mission of the University
5	of Hawaii system, and the responsibilities of the board of
6	regents. Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed
7	as having placed the broad public interest ahead of special
8	interests, having achieved a high level of prominence in their
9	respective professions, and being respected members of the
10	community.
11	(g) Members of the regents candidate advisory council
12	shall serve four year terms.
13	(h) If a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be appointed in
14	the same manner and subject to the same qualifications as the
15	person's predecessor. The person appointed to fill a vacancy
16	shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person's
17	predecessor.
18	(i) The regents candidate advisory council shall operate
19	in a wholly nonpartisan manner. No individual, while a member
20	of the regents candidate advisory council, shall run for or hold
21	any elected office under the United States or the State or any
22	of its political subdivisions.

1	(j) The members of the regents candidate advisory council
2	shall choose a chairperson from among themselves. A majority of
3	all the members to which the regents candidate advisory council
4	is entitled shall constitute a quorum to conduct business. The
5	concurrence of a majority of all the members to which the
6	regents candidate advisory council is entitled shall be
7	necessary to make any action of the regents candidate advisory
8	council valid. The regents candidate advisory council shall
9	meet annually and at other times as necessary. The regents
10	candidate advisory council shall be exempt from part I of
11	chapter 92.
12	(k) Members of the regents candidate advisory council
13	shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for
14	expenses, including travel, board, and lodging expenses,
15	necessary for the performance of their duties.
16	(1) Notwithstanding chapter 92F or any other law to the
17	contrary, all information required by the regents candidate
18	advisory council shall be confidential, including without
19	limitation, all council information obtained, reviewed, or
20	considered before and after council decisionmaking.
21	Confidential regents candidate advisory council information
22	shall include documents, data, or other information that are not
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- 1 of public record, including without limitation, personal
- 2 financial information; the names of applicants; applications and
- 3 the personal, financial, and other information contained therein
- 4 submitted by the applicants to the regents candidate advisory
- 5 council; interviews; schedules; reports; studies; background
- 6 checks; credit reports; surveys and reports prepared for or on
- 7 the regents candidate advisory council's behalf; the results of
- 8 any evaluations or assessments conducted by the regents
- 9 candidate advisory council; the substance and details of any
- 10 discussions with regents candidate advisory council members; and
- 11 the substance and details of discussions and deliberations of
- 12 the regents candidate advisory council and any of its committees
- during meetings."]
- 14 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
- 15 existing members of the board of regents of the University of
- 16 Hawaii who are serving on the effective date of this Act shall
- 17 continue to serve their full terms of office. As each term
- 18 expires, each regent shall be replaced by a member nominated
- 19 and, with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the
- 20 governor pursuant to this Act.
- 21 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 22 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



- 1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon the
- 2 ratification of a constitutional amendment repealing the
- 3 constitutional requirement that the governor make appointments
- 4 to the board of regents of the University of Hawaii from pools
- 5 of candidates presented to the governor by the candidate
- 6 advisory council for the board of regents of the University of
- 7 Hawaii.
