A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAID.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 346-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to	read as follows:
3	"§34	6-14 Duties generally. Except as otherwise provided
4	by law, th	ne department of human services shall:
5	(1)	Establish and administer programs and standards, and
6		adopt rules as deemed necessary for all public
7		assistance programs;
8	(2)	Establish, extend, and strengthen services for the
9		protection and care of abused or neglected children
10		and children in danger of becoming delinquent to make
11		paramount the safety and health of children who have
12		been harmed or are in life circumstances that threater
13		harm;
14	(3)	Establish and administer programs, and adopt rules as
15		deemed necessary, for the prevention of domestic and
16		sexual violence and the protection and treatment of
17		victims of domestic and sexual violence;
18	(4)	Assist in preventing family breakdown;

l	(5)	Place, or cooperate in placing, abused or neglected
2		children in suitable private homes or institutions and
3		place, or cooperate in placing, children in suitable
1		adoptive homes;
5	(6)	Have authority to establish, maintain, and operate

- (6) Have authority to establish, maintain, and operate receiving homes for the temporary care and custody of abused or neglected children until suitable plans are made for their care; and accept from the police and other agencies, for temporary care and custody, any abused or neglected child until satisfactory plans are made for the child;
- (7) Administer the medical assistance programs for eligible public welfare and other medically needy individuals by establishing standards, eligibility, and health care participation rules, payment methodologies, reimbursement allowances, systems to monitor recipient and provider compliance, and assuring compliance with federal requirements to maximize federal financial participation;
- (8) Cooperate with the federal government in carrying out the purposes of the Social Security Act and in other matters of mutual concern pertaining to public

2		services, including the making of reports, the
3		adoption of methods of administration, and the making
4		of rules as are found by the federal government, or
5	r	any properly constituted authority thereunder, to be
6		necessary or desirable for the efficient operation of
7		the plans for public welfare, assistance, and child
8		welfare services or as may be necessary or desirable
9		for the receipt of financial assistance from the
10		federal government;
11	(9)	Carry on research and compile statistics relative to
12		public and private welfare activities throughout the
13		State, including those dealing with dependence,
14		defectiveness, delinquency, and related problems;
15	(10)	Develop plans in cooperation with other public and
16		private agencies for the prevention and treatment of
17		conditions giving rise to public welfare problems;
18	(11)	Adopt rules governing the procedure in hearings,
19		investigations, recording, registration, determination
20		of allowances, and accounting and conduct other
21		activities as may be necessary or proper to carry out
