## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAFFIC SAFETY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The legislature finds that traffic accident 1 SECTION 1. 2 fatalities involving police officers responding to emergency situations are tragic and largely avoidable with certain traffic 3 4 safety precautions. On January 21, 2012, a police officer was killed while the officer's vehicle was stopped in back of a 5 6 stalled vehicle to render assistance on the H-1 freeway. On September 13, 2011, a police officer was killed along Farrington 7 highway while assisting another officer during a traffic stop 8 which also resulted in severe injuries to the officer being 10 assisted. The legislature finds that existing law does not address 11 the specific situation of approaching a police vehicle, or of 12 13 any other emergency vehicle, that is stopped to render 14 assistance to a motorist or another emergency responder. The purpose of this Act is to require a driver to take 15 certain safety precautions when approaching an emergency vehicle 16

that is stopped ahead of the driver.
