BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 89-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 3 "(f) The chairperson of the board shall be responsible for
- 4 the administrative functions of the board. The board may
- 5 appoint an executive officer, attorneys, paralegals, mediators,
- 6 arbitrators, and hearing officers, and [employ other assistants]
- 7 <u>other personnel</u> as it may deem necessary in the performance of
- 8 its functions, prescribe their duties, and fix their
- 9 compensation and provide for reimbursement of actual and
- 10 necessary expenses incurred by them in the performance of their
- 11 duties within the amounts made available by appropriations
- 12 therefor. Section 28-8.3 notwithstanding, [an] any attorney
- 13 employed by the board as a full-time, part-time, or contract
- 14 staff member may represent the board in litigation, draft legal
- 15 documents for the board, and provide other necessary legal
- 16 services to the board and shall not be deemed to be a deputy
- 17 attorney general."
