A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LIBRARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes, sets
- 2 forth the duties and responsibilities of the state board of
- 3 education regarding libraries. This Act makes housekeeping
- 4 amendments that will more accurately reflect long-standing board
- 5 of education and Hawaii state public library system practices.
- 6 These duties and responsibilities, which were initially assigned
- 7 to the board of education, were delegated to and have been
- 8 performed by the state librarian and the Hawaii state public
- 9 library system for many decades.
- 10 This Act also allows the state librarian to appoint the
- 11 state librarian's private secretary. This secretary position
- 12 was originally a permanent secretary IV position that was
- 13 reclassified to a private secretary I position effective on
- 14 October 1, 1983, for the state librarian at that time. This
- 15 position was then abolished on September 1, 1995, by the state
- 16 librarian as part of the budget reductions for the Hawaii state
- 17 public library system. On September 28, 2001, the state
- 18 librarian at the time established a temporary exempt position SB2773 HD1 HMS 2012-3205



- 1 for a private secretary II. On September 15, 2011, the private
- 2 secretary II position was finally established as a permanent
- 3 exempt and excluded position by Act 164, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 4 2011. This Act aligns the law with current practice.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 7 and to read as follows:
- 8 "§312- State librarian; additional duties. The state
- 9 librarian shall collect, purchase, receive gifts of, and
- 10 otherwise acquire all books and other publications proper for
- 11 libraries, and arrange, classify, and catalog the same; provide
- 12 for their safekeeping; expend moneys appropriated by the
- 13 legislature and otherwise acquired for the development, use,
- 14 support, and maintenance of libraries; provide ways and means
- 15 for placing libraries within reach of all residents throughout
- 16 the State and particularly of all public and private school
- 17 children; provide and maintain branch libraries, offices, or
- 18 places for the distribution of books and periodicals throughout
- 19 the State; enter into contracts as may be necessary to carry
- 20 into effect the general duties herein; appoint such officers and
- 21 employees as deemed necessary, all of whom shall be under the
- 22 authority of the governor for purposes of chapters 76, 78, 89,



- 1 and 89C; and adopt rules for the management and use of
- 2 libraries, and for the control of the property under the state
- 3 librarian's management. The state librarian may appoint,
- 4 without regard to chapter 76, one secretary for the state
- 5 librarian. The secretary for the state librarian shall serve at
- 6 the pleasure of the state librarian."
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 312-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "§312-1 Duties of the board of education. The board of
- 10 education shall care for, manage, and control all property set
- 11 apart, donated, loaned to, or in any manner acquired for the use
- 12 of libraries; receive, care for, expend, and account for any
- 13 money which may be received for the purpose of erecting
- 14 buildings for libraries or for any other purposes of the
- 15 libraries[; collect, purchase, receive gifts of, and otherwise
- 16 acquire all books and other publications proper for libraries,
- 17 and arrange, classify, and catalogue the same; provide for their
- 18 safekeeping; expend moneys appropriated by the legislature and
- 19 otherwise acquired for the development, use, support, and
- 20 maintenance of libraries; provide ways and means for placing
- 21 libraries within reach of all residents throughout the State and
- 22 particularly of all public and private school children; provide

8	SECT	ION 4. Section 312-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
9	amended t	o read as follows:	
10	"§31	2-2 Powers of board; special fund. The board of	
11	education	may:	
12	(1)	Except as provided in section 312-3.9, make	
13		arrangements or contracts as are approved by the	
14		governor, with any county, city, association, society,	
15		person, or persons, for the purpose of benefiting the	
16		libraries and increasing their facilities and use;	
17	(2)	Subject to section 26-12, enter into such arrangement	
18		or contract as is approved by the governor, with the	
19		Friends of the Library of Hawaii, for the purpose of	
20		obtaining the use of books and property and income of	
21		the Friends of the Library of Hawaii;	

1	(3)	Cooperate by exchange and otherwise with libraries now
2		existing or hereafter to be formed;
3	(4)	Receive, use, manage, or invest moneys or other
4		property, real, personal, or mixed which may be given,
5		bequeathed, devised, or in any manner received from
6		sources other than the legislature or any federal
7		appropriation for any or all purposes of the
8		libraries;
9	(5)	Deposit with the director of finance in a special fund
10		all moneys donated to the board for library services;
11	(6)	Unless otherwise provided for by the terms and
12		conditions of the donation, convert, at such time as
13		the board may at its sole discretion determine, any or
14		all donations of property, real, personal, or mixed,
15		into money to be deposited into the special fund; and
16	(7)	Expend the moneys in the special fund in accordance
17		with the terms and conditions of each donation for the
18		purposes of the libraries.
19	The board	shall be the trustee of the special fund and all
20	moneys the	erein shall be deemed to have been appropriated to the
21	use and f	or the purposes of the [board] Hawaii state public
22	library s	ystem in providing library services. Nothing in this

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- 1 section shall be construed to limit the powers and duties of the
- 2 board hereinbefore expressed, or to empower the board to
- 3 obligate the State financially in any sum which shall not have
- 4 been appropriated by the legislature for the use of the board."
- 5 SECTION 5. Section 312-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "§312-3 Exchange of librarians. The [board of education]
- 8 state librarian may contract for the exchange of librarians with
- 9 librarians of any state, country, or territory in accordance
- 10 with this section, except as otherwise provided in section
- 11 78-27. Local librarians so exchanged shall be paid their
- 12 regular salaries out of the funds appropriated for personal
- 13 services in the library budget for the library concerned. The
- 14 qualifications of all librarians from any such state, country,
- 15 or territory so exchanged shall be equal to those of the local
- 16 librarians exchanged. In the selection of local librarians for
- 17 exchange, preference shall be given to persons born in the
- 18 State. The requirements of citizenship shall not apply to any
- 19 librarian coming to the State from any foreign state, country,
- 20 or territory under any such contract of exchange. All
- 21 librarians so exchanged shall furnish their own transportation

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- 1 to and from the state, country, or territory with which
- 2 exchanged.
- 3 No compensation shall be paid by the State to visiting
- 4 exchange librarians; provided that in any case where the local
- 5 exchanged librarian becomes incapacitated or, for any reason,
- 6 leaves the exchanged position permanently, the library concerned
- 7 may pay the visiting exchange librarian an amount not to exceed
- 8 the salary rating of the local exchanged librarian, such an
- 9 arrangement to continue until the end of the period of exchange
- 10 or until such time as some satisfactory adjustment has been
- 11 made."
- 12 SECTION 6. Section 312-4.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended as follows:
- 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- 15 "(a) The [board of education] state librarian may charge
- 16 and add a fee to any amount due in accordance with [its] the
- 17 state librarian's duties and powers under section [312-1] 312-
- **18** for:
- 19 (1) Any cost or expense incurred by the Hawaii state
- 20 public library system as a result of any action taken
- 21 to enforce the collection of costs of lost books and
- any overdue fines and fees charged to that patron



1		after the public library system has mailed written
2		notice demanding payment and advising that continued
3		failure to pay the amount due may result in collection
4		action being taken, including the imposition of cost-
5		recovery fees, not to exceed \$10, pursuant to this
6		section. Any cost-recovery fee charged against the
7		patron for costs, fees, and other charges may include
8		collection agency fees, attorneys' fees, court filing
9		fees, and similar fees incurred by the Hawaii state
10		public library system in connection with the
11		collection action;
12	(2)	Hawaii public library system sponsored seminars or
13		workshops, including educational materials in various
14		media format; and
15	(3)	Research and reference materials published on magnetic
16		media, CD-ROM, or other [machine readable] digital or
17		electronic form."
18	2. 1	By amending subsection (d) to read:
19	" (d)	The [board of education] state librarian shall
20	prescribe	the procedures relating to:
21	(1)	The charging of fees;

The waiver of fees;

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1	(3)	The documents, materials, and services for which fees
2		may be charged;
3	(4)	The amount of the fees that may be assessed and
4		charged to a library patron;

15	SECT	ION 7. Section 312-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended to read as follows:	
17	" § 31	2-5 Annual report to the governor. Annually during
18	the month	of July but as of June 30 preceding, the [board of
19	education] state librarian shall report to the governor the	
20	moneys re	ceived from all sources and expended for all purposes
21	during th	e preceding year, and any other matters pertaining to

- 1 the libraries which it may deem important, or the governor may 2 require." SECTION 8. Section 312-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 5 "(a) The [board-of-education, through the] state 6 librarian[-] shall: 7 Provide for the establishment and ongoing operation of (1)8 a fee for enhanced service program, which includes but 9 is not limited to the planning, programming, and budgeting of operating, research and development, and 10 11 capital investment programs; and 12 Administer a special fund to be known as the "library (2) 13 fee for enhanced services special fund"." 14 SECTION 9. Section 312-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 repealed. ["\$312-6 Bond memorial library. The public library 16 17 operated and maintained in Kohala, North Kohala, county of Hawaii, formerly under the name of Kohala Public Library shall 18 19 be designated and known as the "Bond Memorial Library"."]
- 22 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
