## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature reaffirms that it is in the		
2	general welfare of the State to protect, preserve, care for, and		
3	improve the physical and mental health of Hawaii's children by		
4	making available at the public schools first aid and emergency		
5	care, preventive health care, health appraisals and follow-ups,		
6	and health room facilities. For those purposes, the department		
7	of education is authorized to establish a statewide school		
8	health services program. The purpose of this Act is to provide		
9	the department flexibility in administering and implementing the		
10	health services program.		
11	SECTION 2. Section 302A-853, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended to read as follows:		
13	"[+]\$302A-853[] Department implementation.] Administration		
14	of medication. [The department shall implement this program		
15	with the present health services now provided to those schools		
16	under the pilot project established under Act 130, Session Laws		
17	of Hawaii 1970, to each public school, and further provide the		
18	necessary number of health aides to serve each public school.		

1	The department may provide health-related screening services at		
2	each public school. School health aides may assist students by		
3	administering oral and topical medication, and in emergency		
4 .	situations, other premeasured medication; provided that:		
5	(1)	If the student receiving the medication is a minor, a	
6		parent or guardian requests and authorizes the	
7		administration of medication;	
8	(2)	The medication has been prescribed by a licensed	
9		physician, as defined in section 334-1, or by a	
10		practitioner with prescriptive authority;	
11	(3)	The administration of the medication is with the	
12		approval of the department of health; and	
13	(4)	The administration of the medication is necessary for	
14		the health of the student and for the student's	
15		attendance at school."	
16	SECT	ION 3. Section 302A-854, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
17	amended t	o read as follows:	
18	"[ <del>{</del> ]	§302A-854[] School health aides[-]; compensation.	
19	All full-	time school health aides employed in the department	
20	shall be	employed and have their compensation fixed in	
21	accordance with chapter 76 and the appropriate collective
