## A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD HEALTH.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1		PART I
2	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established a childhood obesity
3	preventio	n task force to develop and recommend legislation
4	related t	o the prevention of childhood obesity.
5	(b)	The task force shall be composed of:
6	(1)	The director of finance, or the director's designee;
7	(2)	The director of commerce and consumer affairs, or the
8		director's designee;
9	(3)	The superintendent of education, or the
10		superintendent's designee;
11	(4)	The director of health, or the director's designee;
12	(5)	The director of human services, or the director's
13		designee;
14	(6)	The director of taxation, or the director's designee;
15	(7)	A representative from the department of the attorney
16		general;
17	(8)	A representative from the state advisory council on
18		early childhood education and care;

1	(9)	A representative from the board of education;
2	(10)	A representative from the department of the attorney
3		general;
4	(11)	A representative from the University of Hawaii's
5		department of public health sciences;
6	(12)	A representative from the University of Hawaii's John
7		A. Burns school of medicine;
8	(13)	A representative from the American Heart Association;
9	(14)	A representative from the American Cancer Association;
10	(15)	A representative from the American Diabetes
11		Association;
12	(16)	A representative from the Hawaii Association for the
13		Education of Young Children;
14	(17)	A representative from the house of representatives;
15	(18)	A representative from the senate; and
16	(19)	A representative selected by the governor.
17	(c)	The director of health shall serve as the chairperson
18	or may de	signate a chairperson and vice-chair person.
19	(d)	The childhood obesity prevention task force shall:
20	(1)	Assemble accurate research, fiscal and demographic
21		information, and justification to support policy
22.		development, and track outcomes; and

1	(2)	Research other state, county, and organizational
2		policy agendas and suggested best practices related to
3		childhood obesity prevention policies.

- 4 (e) The task force may create subcommittees for the
- 5 purpose of developing policy recommendations.
- 6 (f) The task force shall meet at least monthly from July7 through November 2012.
- 8 (g) The task force shall be administratively attached to9 the department of health.
- 10 (h) Members of the task force shall not receive

  11 compensation for their services but shall be reimbursed for

  12 necessary expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in the

  13 performance of their duties under this Act.
- (i) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations, including proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2013 regular session, and shall be dissolved on December 31, 2012.
