### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

DEPARTMENT:

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII ADVISORY COMMISSION ON DRUG ABUSE AND CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

PURPOSE:

To amend duties and responsibilities of the Hawaii Advisory Commission on Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances (HACDACS) to provide for more focused attention in addressing the issue of substance abuse as a public health issue.

MEANS:

Amend section 329-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

The Hawaii Advisory Commission on Drug Abuse and Controlled Substances (HACDACS) is administratively assigned to the Department of Health (DOH). The Commission is composed of volunteers who represent pharmacological, medical, community and business affairs, youth action, educational, legal defense, enforcement, and corrections segments of the community. One member is concurrently appointed to the State Council on Mental Health pursuant to section 334-10, HRS.

When the Department of Public Safety (PSD) was created, responsibility for the registration and control of the manufacture, distribution, prescription, and dispensing of controlled substances and precursor or essential chemicals was transferred from DOH to PSD.

Amendments in this "housekeeping" measure will more closely align the duties of the Commission with the three core functions of public health: assessment (i.e., monitoring trends and needs), policy development on

public health issues, and assurance of appropriate public health services.

Impact on the public: Amendments will provide for a more focused attention in addressing the issue of substance abuse as a public health issue.

Impact on the department and other agencies: The composition and number of members on the Commission will remain unchanged and will continue to provide for a broad-based representation of the community.
