BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 321-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) This section shall apply to all volunteer medical 4 assistance personnel, including: 5 (1) Physicians; 6 (2) Psychologists; 7 (3) Nurses; 8 (4)Emergency medical technicians; Social workers; 9 (5) 10 (6) Mobile intensive care technicians; [and] 11 Physician assistants [-]; and (7) 12 (8) Pharmacists, 13 licensed or certified in this State, or employed by a health 14 care facility, while providing volunteer medical assistance 15 services." SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

PURPOSE:

MEANS:

Add pharmacists to section 321-2.5 (a),

JUSTIFICATION:

This amendment would provide immunity from

liability to pharmacists providing

volunteer services on behalf of the State

or counties, such as school-based

immunization clinics. Lack of coverage for professional liability may mean that these valuable workers will not participate as state volunteers, thereby limiting the ability of the State to draw upon their skills as a critical public health

skills as a cilcical public

resource.

Impact on the public: Pharmacists could volunteer their time without fear of exposure to undo risk, and the public at large could benefit from their donation of

time and expertise.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Adding pharmacists to this section should improve the preparation for disaster response, increase the ability to recruit, train, and retain volunteer

medical professionals.
