Section 321-22.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 3 The moneys in the trauma system special fund shall be 4 used by the department to support the continuing development and 5 operation of a comprehensive state trauma system. 6 system special fund shall be used to subsidize the documented 7 costs for the comprehensive state trauma system, including but 8 not limited to the following: 9 Costs of under-compensated and uncompensated trauma 10 care incurred by hospitals providing care to trauma 11 patients; [and] 12 (2) Costs incurred by hospitals providing care to trauma 13 patients to maintain on-call physicians for trauma 14 care[-]; and15 (3) Costs to staff and operate the State's injury **16** prevention program. **17** The money in the trauma system special fund shall not be used to supplant funding for trauma services authorized prior to 18

PURPOSE:

Allow moneys in the trauma system special

fund to be used to staff and operate the

State's injury prevention program.

MEANS:

Amend section 321-22.5(b), Hawaii Revised

Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Injury prevention is an essential part of a comprehensive trauma system. Injury prevention efforts, including policy level changes and community education efforts, are necessary to reduce the burden of injury for Hawaii. The Emergency Medical Services and Injury Prevention System Branch oversees the Trauma System Special Fund. DOH has a strong injury prevention program but the current 25% reduction in the CDC Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHBG) funding and the possible elimination of this funding in fiscal year 2012-2013 threaten the program's ability to provide public health programs and initiatives to reduce injuries in Hawaii. It is appropriate and prudent to change the method of funding from federal (PHHSBG) to Trauma System Special Fund.

Impact on the public: The Injury Prevention and Control positions are essential for the Department of Health's efforts to reduce the burden of injury for the State.

Impact on the department and other agencies:
The department will not be impacted as the
Trauma System Special Fund has sufficient
funds to cover the additional personnel
costs.
