A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TAX CLEARANCE FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Taxpayers are required to obtain tax clearances
- 2 from the department of taxation for various purposes, including
- 3 obtaining a government contract or receiving final payment on a
- 4 government contract. Currently, taxpayers may obtain a tax
- 5 clearance without paying a fee. The department of taxation
- 6 processes approximately twenty thousand to thirty thousand tax
- 7 clearance requests each year. In addition, certified copies of
- 8 a tax clearance may also be obtained from the department of
- 9 taxation without paying a fee. Approximately thirty thousand
- 10 certified copies of tax clearances are provided each year. This
- 11 Act would impose a \$20 fee for a tax clearance and a \$5 fee for
- 12 a certified copy of a tax clearance.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 231, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 15 and to read as follows:
- 16 "\$231- Tax clearance fees. The department may charge a
- 17 fee of \$20 for each tax clearance request submitted by a
- 18 taxpayer and \$5 for each certified copy of a tax clearance

- 1 issued to a taxpayer; provided that electronic tax clearance
- 2 requests may be submitted by taxpayers online at no charge. The
- 3 department may charge additional fees related to the issuance of
- 4 tax clearances."
- 5 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 7 and shall apply to requests for tax clearances and requests for
- 8 certified copies of tax clearances received after June 30, 2012.
