## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 291, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§291- Mobile electronic devices; use while operating a
5	commercial motor vehicle prohibited. (a) No person with a
6	commercial driver's license shall use a mobile electronic
7	device, including using the mobile electronic device for texting
8	as defined under section 286-231, while operating a commercial
9	motor vehicle, as defined under section 286-2.
10	(b) The use of a mobile electronic device for the sole
11	purpose of making a "911" emergency communication shall be an
12	affirmative defense to this section.
13	(c) The following persons shall be exempt from the
14	provisions of subsection (a):
15	(1) Emergency responders using a mobile electronic device
16	while in the performance and scope of their official
17	duties;

1	(2)	Drivers using two-way radios while in the performance
2		and scope of their work-related duties and who are
3		operating motor carrier vehicles as defined in section
4		286-201; and
5	(3)	Drivers holding a valid amateur radio operator license
6		issued by the Federal Communications Commission and
7		using a half-duplex two-way radio.
8	<u>(d)</u>	Any person who is convicted of violating subsection
9	(a) shall	be fined not more than \$2,750 in addition to the
10	driving d	isqualification of section 286-240(e).
11	<u>(e)</u>	As used in this section:
12	"Eme	rgency responders" means any firefighters, emergency
13	medical t	echnicians, mobile intensive care technicians, civil
14	<u>defense w</u>	orkers, police officers, and federal and state law
15	enforceme	mt officers.
16	"Mob	ile electronic device" means any handheld or other
17	portable	electronic equipment recognized by the citing officer
18	or other	witness to be capable of providing wireless or data
19	communica	tions, or both, between two or more persons or of
20	providing	amusement, including but not limited to a cellular
21	phone, te	xt messaging device, paging device, personal digital
22	assistant	, laptop computer, video game, or digital photographic

- 1 device, or any device to input, write, send, receive, or read
- 2 text, but does not include any equipment installed in a
- 3 commercial motor vehicle for the purpose of providing audio,
- 4 navigation, or emergency assistance to the operator of the
- 5 commercial motor vehicle or video entertainment to the
- 6 passengers in the rear seats of the commercial motor vehicle. A
- 7 "two-way radio" or Private Land Mobile Radio System as defined
- 8 by Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 90, when
- 9 used for business purposes, shall not be considered to be a
- 10 "mobile electronic device".
- "Operate a commercial motor vehicle" means to drive or
- 12 assume actual physical control of a commercial motor vehicle
- 13 upon a public way, street, road, or highway in the State.
- "Texting" means the same as defined under 286-231.
- 15 "Use or using a mobile electronic device" means holding a
- 16 mobile electronic device while operating a commercial motor
- 17 vehicle."
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 286-231, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended as follows:
- 20 1. By adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 21 and to read:

1	" <u>" Te</u>	xting" means manually entering alphanumeric text into,
2	or readin	g text from, an electronic device, and includes short
3	message s	ervice; e-mailing; instant messaging; a command or
4	request t	o access a world wide web page; and engaging in any
5	other for	m of electronic text retrieval or entry, for present or
6	future co	mmunication.
7	"Tex	ting" does not include:
8	(1)	Reading, selecting, or entering a telephone number, an
9		extension number, or voicemail retrieval codes and
10		commands into an electronic device for the purpose of
11		initiating or receiving a phone call or using voice
12		commands to initiate or receive a telephone call;
13	(2)	Inputting, selecting, or reading information on a
14		global positioning system or navigation system; or
15	(3)	Using a device capable of performing multiple
16	÷	functions, including fleet management systems,
17		dispatching devices, smart phones, citizens band
18		radios, and music players, for a purpose that is not
19		otherwise prohibited in this part."
20	2.	By amending the definition of "serious traffic
21	violation	" to read:

2	following	offenses when operating a commercial motor vehicle,
3	except for	r weight, defect, and parking violations:
4	(1)	Excessive speeding[7] involving any single offense for

9		property, including but not limited to offenses of
10		driving a commercial motor vehicle in wilful or wanton

12	(3)	Improper or erratic traffic lane changes;
13	(4)	Following a vehicle ahead too closely;
14	(5)	A violation of any state or local law relating to
15		motor vehicle traffic control, other than a parking
16		violation, arising in connection with a fatal traffic
17		accident;
18	(6)	Driving a commercial motor vehicle without obtaining a
19		commercial driver's license;
20	(7)	Driving a commercial motor vehicle without a
21		commercial driver's license in the driver's
22		possession; provided that this paragraph shall not

T		apply to a citation issued under, or an offense	
2		disposed of pursuant to $[\tau]$ section 286-116(a) or a	
3		substantially similar provision of law in another	
4		state; [ <del>or</del> ]	
5	(8)	Driving a commercial motor vehicle without the proper	
6		class or endorsements of commercial driver's license	
7		for the specific vehicle group being operated or for	
8		the passengers or type of cargo being transported[-];

10	(9)	Texting while driving in violation of a state or	
11		county law or ordinance."	
12	SECT	ION 3. Section 286-235, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
13	amended to read as follows:		
14	"§28	6-235 Commercial driver's license required. (a) No	
15	person sh	all drive a commercial motor vehicle unless the person	
16	holds a valid commercial driver's license and valid applicable		
17	endorsements for the vehicle the person is driving, except when		
18	driving under a commercial driver's instruction permit and		
19	accompanied by the holder of a valid commercial driver's licens		
20	for the v	ehicle being driven.

- 1 (b) No person shall operate a commercial motor vehicle
- 2 without a commercial driver's license in such person's
- 3 possession.
- 4 [\(\frac{\text{(b)}}{\text{-}}\)] (c) No person shall drive a commercial motor vehicle
- 5 while the person's driver's license or permit is suspended,
- 6 revoked, or canceled, or while subject to a disqualification.
- 7 [<del>(c)</del>] (d) No person shall drive a commercial motor vehicle
- 8 in violation of an out-of-service order."
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 10 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 11 begun before its effective date.
- 12 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.

## Report Title:

Commercial Driver's License; Electronic Devices; Texting

## Description:

Prohibits driving a commercial motor vehicle without possession of commercial driver's license; prohibits the use of mobile electronic devices, including for texting, while operating a commercial motor vehicle. Exempts certain drivers and "911" communication. Effective January 7, 2059. (SB2871 HD2)
