# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMMERCIAL HARBORS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§266- Enforcement of rules. Any employee or officer,
5	or representative of the department conferred by the director as
6	a law enforcement officer or harbor agent, shall enforce any
7	rule adopted pursuant to this part, with the issuance of a
8	notice of violation to the purported violator. The printed
9	notice of violation shall identify the charge against the
10	purported violator and direct the purported violator to:
11	(1) Appear before an administrative hearing and answer to
12	the charge against the purported; or
13	(2) Remit a fee, the amount of which shall be written on
14	the notice of violation, to the harbor special fund,
15	in lieu of paragraph (1).
16	The purported violator shall have ten calendar days after
17	receipt of the notice of the violation to make a written request
18	for an administrative hearing. The administrative hearing is

solely for the purpose of allowing the purported violator to

    department. The department shall schedule the administrative

    hearing within thirty days of the department's receipt of the

         SECTION 2. Section 266-19, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

         "(a) There is created in the treasury of the State the
    harbor special fund. All moneys received by the department of

    transportation from the rates [and], fees, fines, and penalties

    pursuant to [section] sections 266-17(a)(1), 266-25, 266-28, and

    266- shall be paid into the harbor special fund. The harbor

    special fund and the second separate harbor special fund
    heretofore created shall be consolidated into the harbor special

- 5 powers, duties, and functions of the department of
- 6 transportation related to the statewide system of harbors
- 7 [(excluding properties principally used for recreation or the
- 8 landing of fish, except the properties located at Kewalo Basin,

- 10 limitation, the costs of operation, maintenance, and repair of
- 11 the statewide system of harbors and reserves therefor, and

- 18 SECTION 3. Section 266-24.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 "\$266-24.1 Arrest or citation. [Except when required by
- 21 state law to take] Any employee, officer, or representative of
- 22 the department conferred by the director with police powers,



hereinafter referred to as law enforcement officer, shall 1 enforce any rule adopted pursuant to this part and chapters 287 2 through 291E, 705, 707 through 710, 712, and 712A. The law 3 enforcement officer shall take immediately before a district 4 5 judge, a person issued a citation or arrested for a violation of any provision of this part, including any rule [or regulation] 6 adopted [and promulgated] pursuant to this part[, any person 7 8 authorized to enforce the provisions of this part, hereinafter referred to as enforcement officer, ]. Any law enforcement 9 officer upon issuing a citation or arresting a person for 10 [violation of] violating any provision of this part, including 11 any rule [or regulation] adopted [and promulgated] pursuant to 12 this part [shall], in the discretion of the law enforcement 13 officer, shall either: 14 [issue] Issue to the purported violator a summons or 15 (1)citation, printed in the form hereinafter described, 16 17 warning the purported violator to appear and answer to 18 the charge against the purported violator at a certain place and at a time within seven days after such 19 20 arrest[-]; or21 (2) [take] Take the purported violator without unnecessary

delay before a district judge.

- The summons or citation shall be printed in a form 1 comparable to the form of other summonses and citations used for 2 3 arresting offenders and shall be designed to provide for 4 inclusion of all necessary information. The form and content of 5 such summons or citation shall be adopted or prescribed by the 6 district courts. The original of a summons or citation shall be given to the 7 8 purported violator and the other copy or copies distributed in 9 the manner prescribed by the district courts; provided that the **10** district courts may prescribe alternative methods of 11 distribution for the original and any other copies. 12 Summonses and citations shall be consecutively numbered and 13 the carbon copy or copies of each shall bear the same number. 14 [Any] Except for the enforcement of chapters 287 through 15 291E, 705, 707 through 710, 712, and 712A, any person who fails 16 to appear at the place and within the time specified in the 17 summons or citation issued to the person by the law enforcement 18 officer, upon the person's arrest for violation of any provision 19 of this part, including any rule [or regulation promulgated] 20 adopted pursuant to this part, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor 21 and, on conviction, shall be fined not more than \$1,000, or be 22 imprisoned not more than six months, or both.

- In the event any person fails to comply with a summons or 1 2 citation issued to such person, or if any person fails or refuses to deposit bail as required, the enforcement officer 3 4 shall cause a complaint to be entered against such person and 5 secure the issuance of a warrant for the person's arrest. 6 When a complaint is made to any prosecuting officer of the 7 violation of any provision of this part, including any rule [ox regulation promulgated] adopted thereunder, the law enforcement 8 9 officer who issued the summons or citation shall subscribe to it 10 under oath administered by another official of the department of transportation whose names have been submitted to the 11 12 prosecuting officer and who have been designated by the director 13 of transportation to administer the same." 14 SECTION 4. Section 266-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 15 "§266-25 Violation of rules; penalty. In addition to the 16 **17** reimbursement of fines and costs as provided in section 266-28, 18 any person who violates any rule made, adopted, and published by 19 the department of transportation as herein provided, or who 20 violates any lawful command of any harbor master, harbor agent, 21 facility security officer, or harbor district manager, while in 22 the discharge of the person's duty, or who violates this

- 1 chapter, shall be fined not more than \$10,000 for each offense,
- 2 and any vessel, the agents, owner, or crew of which violate the
- 3 rules of the department or this chapter, shall be fined not more
- 4 than \$10,000 for each violation; provided that in addition to or
- 5 as a condition to the suspension of the fines and penalties, the
- 6 court or administrative hearing officer may deprive the offender
- 7 of the privilege of entering the secured area of the port or
- 8 obtaining an operating or mooring permit for any vessel in state
- 9 waters for a period of not more than [two years.] one year;
- 10 provided further that the offender at the resumption of the
- 11 privilege of operating or mooring a vessel in state waters shall
- 12 assume the last position on any waiting list."
- 13 SECTION 5. Section 266-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- "[+]§266-28[+] Fines arising from environmental protection
- 16 and maritime transportation security violations.
- 17 Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, any commercial
- 18 harbor tenant or user, including any shipper or shipping agent,
- 19 who violates any federal, state, or county law or rule relating
- 20 to environmental protection and maritime transportation security
- 21 pursuant to 33 Code of Federal Regulations chapter 1 and thereby
- 22 causes a fine to be levied by the United States Coast Guard upon

- 1 the department, shall reimburse the department for the entire
- 2 amount of the fine. The department may take such actions
- 3 necessary to collect and deposit any amount reimbursable under
- 4 this section[-] into the harbor special fund, and may also
- 5 demand reimbursement for costs or expenses incurred by the
- 6 department resulting from enforcement of this section."
- 7 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

### Report Title:

Department of Transportation, Harbors; Administrative Violations of Rules; Reimbursement from Tenant for Security Violations

### Description:

Amends chapter 266, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to clarify that persons cited for non-criminal violations may appeal through an administrative hearing; clarifies that enforcement agents such as the harbor master, harbor agents, facility security officer, or district manager can issue citations for non-criminal violations; provides that penalties and fines are deposited into the harbor special fund; allows the department of transportation to seek reimbursement from tenants or harbor users that violate security rules in harbor-secured areas. The issuance of citations for traffic code violations and other criminal statutes are restricted to law enforcement officers and fines and penalties remain in the jurisdiction of the District Courts.
