A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NATIVE HAWAIIAN ORGANIZATION NOTIFICATION LIST.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature f	inds that the Office of
2	Hawaiian Relations within the Offic	ce of the Secretary, United
3	States Department of the Interior,	created the Native Hawaiian
4	Organization Notification List in 2007 in order to:	
5	(1) Assist the Department of	the Interior and other
6	agencies to locate, comm	unicate, and consult with
7	interested Native Hawaii	an organizations per the
8	statutory notification of	bligations under laws such as
9	the National Environment	al Policy Act, the National
10	Historic Preservation Ac	t, and the Native American
11	Graves Protection and Re	patriation Act or when
12	otherwise desired; and	
13	(2) Promote networking, arti	culation, and collaboration
14	among all Native Hawaiia	n organizations.
15	The purpose of this Act is to	require the office of
16	Hawaiian affairs to make accessibl	e the federal Native Hawaiian
17	Organizations Notification List to	identify organizations to

which state agencies may disseminate information, and with which



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1 state agencies may communicate regarding issues that may affect

2 Native Hawaiians, including kuleana lands and curatorship.

3 SECTION 2. Section 10-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4 amended to read as follows:

5 "\$10-3 Purpose of the office. The purposes of the office

6 of Hawaiian affairs include:

(1)The betterment of conditions of native Hawaiians. A pro rata portion of all funds derived from the public land trust shall be funded in an amount to be determined by the legislature for this purpose, and shall be held and used solely as a public trust for the betterment of the conditions of native Hawaiians. For the purpose of this chapter, the public land trust shall be all proceeds and income from the sale, lease, or other disposition of lands ceded to the United States by the Republic of Hawaii under the joint resolution of annexation, approved July 7, 1898 (30 Stat. 750), or acquired in exchange for lands so ceded, and conveyed to the State of Hawaii by virtue of section 5(b) of the Act of March 18, 1959 (73 Stat. 4, the Admissions Act), (excluding therefrom lands and all proceeds and income from the sale, lease, or

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1		disposition of lands defined as "available lands" by
2		section 203 of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act,
3	·	1920, as amended), and all proceeds and income from
4		the sale, lease, or other disposition of lands
5		retained by the United States under sections 5(c) and
6		5(d) of the Act of March 18, 1959, later conveyed to
7		the State under section 5(e);
8	(2)	The betterment of conditions of Hawaiians;
9	(3)	Serving as the principal public agency in this State
10		responsible for the performance, development, and
11		coordination of programs and activities relating to
12		native Hawaiians and Hawaiians[+] including making the
13		most recent version of the federal Native Hawaiian
14		Organization Notification List available to state
15		agencies and, upon request, other interested parties
16		as a resource by which agencies may disseminate
17		information and locate organizations to contact
18		regarding issues such as kuleana lands and
19		curatorship; except that the Hawaiian Homes Commission
20		Act, 1920, as amended, shall be administered by the
21		Hawaiian homes commission;

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Assessing the policies and practices of other agencies 1 (4)impacting on native Hawaiians and Hawaiians, and 2 3 conducting advocacy efforts for native Hawaiians and Hawaiians; 5 (5) Applying for, receiving, and disbursing, grants and donations from all sources for native Hawaiian and 6 Hawaiian programs and services; and Serving as a receptacle for reparations." 8 (6) 9 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
