A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SPECIAL EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that using sign language
- and cued speech benefits children of many ages and specific 2
- populations, including children with autism, dyslexia, specific 3
- 4 language impairments, and Down syndrome. The legislature also
- finds that the department of education should determine when 5
- sign language and cued speech services are appropriate. 6
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that the department of
- 8 education makes sign language and cued speech services available
- to children who are deaf or hard of hearing and other children 9
- 10 with a disability for whom sign language or cued speech services
- 11 would be appropriate.
- SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 12
- amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 13
- and to read as follows: 14
- 15 "§302A-Special education; sign language and cued
- (a) The department shall ensure that sign language and 16 speech.
- cued speech services are available to: 17
- 18 A child who is deaf or hard of hearing; and





1	(2) A child for whom sign language and cued speech
2	services would be appropriate, as determined by the
3	child's individualized education program.
4	(b) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapte:
5	91 to effectuate this section.
6	(c) As used in this section:
7	"Cued speech" means a phonemic-based system of
8	communication that uses a small number of hand shapes in
9	different locations near the mouth to supplement lip reading.
10	"Individualized education program" refers to a program
11	authorized under section 302A-443.
12	"Sign language" means a language that uses visually
13	transmitted sign patterns such as hand shapes, positions,
14	movements, facial expressions, and body movements to convey
15	meaning. Sign language includes American Sign Language.
16	"Sign language and cued speech services" means the
17	instruction of sign language and cued speech, provision of
18	simultaneous communication, provision of oral transliteration
19	services such as amplification, and provision of sign language
20	and cued speech interpretation. "
21	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
