# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OCEAN SAFETY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that increased
2	recreational and commercial activities in Hawaii's nearshore
3	waters have led to safety concerns and, in some cases, tragic
4	results. According to the department of land and natural
5	resources, there were at least four accidents involving swimmers
6	and divers being struck by boats in 2011. In December 2011, a
7	man died after being struck by a boat in waters off of Hanakoo
8	beach park on the island of Maui.
9	Many nearshore areas statewide are popular attractions for
10	multiple ocean activities. The legislature finds that one such
11	area is Kamaole beach on the island of Maui. The amount of
12	growth on Maui has resulted in an overabundance of ocean and
13	beach goers and the legislature finds that there is a compelling
14	need to provide safe and suitable areas for residents and
15	visitors to enjoy the water.
16	The legislature finds that adopting and enforcing stricter

rules and regulations that protect ocean users and installing

safety features such as swim zone buoys to more clearly

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delineate areas reserved for differing uses will ensure greater 1 2 ocean safety in highly populated areas of the State. 3 The purpose of this Act is to improve ocean safety by: 4 (1)Requiring the Department of Land and Natural Resources 5 to adopt rules imposing stricter regulations for the 6 safety of ocean users; and 7 (2) Appropriating funds for swim zone buoys at Kamaole 8 beach. SECTION 2. Chapter 200, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 10 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 11 and to read as follows: 12 Safety of ocean users; rules. The department 13 shall adopt rules to promote greater safety of ocean users in the State's nearshore waters. The rules shall include but not 14 15 be limited to the creation of safe zones for free divers and swimmers and stricter enforcement of boating regulations around 16 **17** swim zone buoys." 18 SECTION 3. The legislature finds that eight swim zone 19 buoys are needed at the following coordinates: Buoy 1: N 20° 42.623, W 156° 26.836; 20 (1) Buoy 2: N 20° 42.736, W 156° 26.863; 21 (2)

         SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general

    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $500,000 or so much
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    thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the
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    installation of eight swim zone buoys at Kamaole beach at the
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    coordinates specified in section 3 of this Act for the purpose

    of increasing the safety of ocean users.
         The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
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    land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
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         SECTION 5. The department shall report to the legislature
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    on the status of rule making and adoption pursuant to section 2
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    of this Act and any other measures taken to promote the safety
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    of ocean and beach users in the State's nearshore waters, no
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    later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2013

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         SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012.
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### Report Title:

Department of Land and Natural Resources; Ocean Safety; Swim Zone Buoys; Appropriation

### Description:
