BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 708-830.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: "§708-830.5 Theft in the first degree. (1) A person 3 4 commits the offense of theft in the first degree if the person commits theft: 5 Of property or services, the value of which exceeds 6 (a) 7 \$20,000; Of a firearm; 8 (b) Of dynamite or other explosive; [or] 9 (C) Of property or services during the time of a civil 10 (d) defense emergency proclaimed by the governor pursuant 11 12 to chapter 128, within the area covered by the civil defense emergency or during the period of disaster 13 relief under chapter 127, the value of which exceeds 14 15 \$300[-]; Of an aquacultural product or part thereof from 16 (e) premises that are fenced or enclosed in a manner 17 designed to exclude intruders or there is prominently **18**
