A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDLIFE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the
- 2 interisland transportation of wild or feral deer.
- 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 183D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
- 5 designated and to read as follows:
- 6 "S183D- Interisland transportation of wild or feral deer
- 7 prohibited. (a) No person shall intentionally, knowingly, or
- 8 recklessly transfer, transport, or release after transport
- 9 through interisland movement any wild or feral deer; provided
- 10 that specimens of wild or feral deer required for scientific or
- 11 educational purposes may be transported only when authorized
- 12 under a permit issued by the department.
- 13 (b) For purposes of this section, a deer that has been
- 14 captured shall no longer be considered feral."
- 15 SECTION 3. Section 183D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 16 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 17 and to read as follows:

3	SECT	TION 4. Section 183D-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended t	o read as follows:
5	" <u>\$</u> 18	3D-5 Penalties. (a) Any person violating section
6	183D-21,	183D-25, 183D-33, or 183D-63 or any rule adopted under
7	this chap	ter shall be guilty of a petty misdemeanor, and upon
8	convictio	n thereof, shall be punished as follows:
9	(1)	For a first conviction, by a mandatory fine of not
10		less than \$100, or imprisonment of not more than
11		thirty days, or both;
12	(2)	For a second conviction within five years of a
13		previous conviction, by a mandatory fine of not less
14		than \$500, or by imprisonment of not more than thirty
15		days, or both, and all firearms used in the commission
16		of [such] the violations shall be considered
17		contraband to be forfeited to and disposed of by the
18		State; and
19	(3)	For a third or subsequent conviction within five years
20		of the first two or more convictions, by a mandatory
21		fine of not less than \$1,000, or by imprisonment of
22		not more than thirty days, or both, and all firearms

1		used in the commission of [such] the violations shall
2		be considered contraband to be forfeited to and
3		disposed of by the State.
4	(b)	Any person violating section 183D-25.5, 183D-26,
5	183D-27,	183D-32, 183D-62, or 183D-64 shall be guilty of a
6	misdemear	nor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished as
7	follows:	
8	(1)	For a first conviction by a mandatory fine of not less
9		than \$200, or by imprisonment of not more than one
10		year, or both;
11	(2)	For a second conviction within five years of a
12		previous conviction, by a mandatory fine of not less
13		than \$1,000, or by imprisonment of not more than one
14		year, or both, and all firearms used in the commission
15		of [such] the violations shall be considered
16		contraband to be forfeited to and disposed of by the
17		State; and
18	(3)	For a third or subsequent conviction within five years
19		of the first two or more convictions, by a mandatory
20		fine of not less than \$2,000, or by imprisonment of
21		not more than one year, or both, and all firearms used
22		in the commission of [such] the violations shall be

1		considered contraband to be forfeited to and disposed
2		of by the State.
3	<u>(c)</u>	Any person who violates section 183D- shall be
4	guilty of	a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be
5	punished	as follows:
6	(1)	For a first conviction, by a mandatory fine of not
7		less than \$10,000 and payment of any costs incurred in
8		the eradication of any deer that has been transferred,
9		transported, or released after transport and the
10		deer's progeny, or by imprisonment of not more than
11		one year, or both;
12	(2)	For a second conviction within five years of a
13		previous conviction, by a mandatory fine of not less
14		than \$15,000 and payment of any costs incurred in the
15		eradication of any deer that has been transferred,
16		transported, or released after transport and the
17		deer's progeny, or by imprisonment of not more than
18		one year, or both; and
19	(3)	For a third or subsequent conviction within five years
20		of the first two or more convictions, by a mandatory
21		fine of not less than \$25,000 and payment of any costs
22		incurred in the eradication of any deer that has been

1	transferred, transported, or released after transport
2	and the deer's progeny, or by imprisonment of not more
3	than one year, or both.
4	[(c)] <u>(d)</u> Any person who violates section 183D-35, 183D-36,
5	183D-37, 183D-38, 183D-39, 183D-40, or 183D-42 shall be guilty
6	of a petty misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be
7	fined not less than \$100 or imprisoned not more than thirty
8	days, or both.
9	[(d)] <u>(e)</u> In addition to any other penalty imposed under
10	this section, a mandatory fine of \$100 shall be levied for each
11	bird illegally taken under this chapter and a mandatory fine of
12	\$500 shall be levied for each mammal illegally taken under this
13	chapter.
14	$[\frac{(e)}{(e)}]$ Any person who is convicted of violating any of
15	the game laws of the State shall immediately have [their] the
16	person's hunting license forfeited and any person convicted for
17	a second offense shall not be granted a license to hunt for a
18	period of three years after the date of the second conviction.
19	$\left[\frac{f}{f}\right]$ $\left[\frac{g}{g}\right]$ The court, in lieu of the actual cash payment of
20	any mandatory fine, may allow the defendant to perform [such]
21	the community service as directed by the department of land and

- 1 natural resources at the rate of one hour of service for every
- 2 \$10 of mandatory fine imposed.
- 3 [(g)] (h) Any criminal action against a person for any
- 4 violation of this chapter shall not be deemed to preclude the
- 5 State from pursuing civil legal action to recover administrative
- 6 fines and costs against that person. Any civil legal action
- 7 against a person to recover administrative fines and costs for
- 8 any violation of subtitle 4 of title 12 or any rule adopted
- 9 thereunder shall not be deemed to preclude the State from
- 10 pursuing any criminal action against that person."
- 11 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
