A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDLIFE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to prohibit the
- 2 interisland transportation of wild or feral mammals.
- 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 183D, part IV, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 4 is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately
- 5 designated and to read as follows:
- 6 "S183D- Interisland transportation of wild or feral
- 7 mammals prohibited. No person shall intentionally, knowingly,
- 8 or recklessly transfer, transport, or release after transport
- 9 through interisland movement any wild or feral mammal; provided
- 10 that specimens of wild or feral mammals required for scientific
- 11 or educational purposes may be transported only when authorized
- 12 under permits issued by the department."
- 13 SECTION 3. Section 183D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 15 and to read as follows:
- ""Release" means to free an animal from effective
- 17 confinement or restraint."

- 6 any violation of subtitle 4 of title 12 or any rule adopted
- 7 thereunder shall not be deemed to preclude the State from
