

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- The legislature finds that the department of SECTION 1. 1
- transportation is charged with the implementation of the bridge 2
- rehabilitation and replacement program for bridges with a 3
- sufficiency rating of less than eighty to be designed and 4
- constructed. There are currently seven hundred fifty-six state-5
- owned bridges, of which two hundred fifty are functionally 6
- obsolete and thirty-nine are structurally deficient. 7
- Functionally obsolete bridges are defined as bridges with 8
- geometric deficiencies such as a bridge being too narrow. 9
- Structurally deficient bridges are defined as bridges with a 10
- poor assessment of the structural condition of the bridge 11
- including the waterway opening adequacy. 12
- There are currently thirty bridges under the department of 13
- transportation that are in the design phase that are planned for 14
- rehabilitation and replacement, in addition to the Hana highway 15
- bridge preservation plan, which needs to move forward for 16
- construction, that are either functionally obsolete or 17
- 18 structurally deficient.





- 1 The purpose of this Act is to expedite construction 2 projects for the bridge rehabilitation and replacement program 3 by providing temporary exemptions from certain state and county 4 requirements. 5 SECTION 2. Beginning July 1, 2012, and ending June 30, 6 2017, the department of transportation and any of its 7 contractors shall be exempt from state requirements under the 8 following, but only to the extent as necessary to expedite the 9 projects enumerated under section 3 of this Act: Chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, historic 10 (1) 11 preservation; Part II of chapter 171, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 12 (2) 13 public lands; 14 (3) Chapter 174C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, state water 15 code; Chapter 180, Hawaii Revised Statutes, soil and water 16 (4)17 conservation districts; 18 (5) Chapter 180C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, soil erosion 19 and sediment control; 20 (6) Chapter 183, Hawaii Revised Statutes, forest reserves, 21 water development, zoning; 22 Chapter 183D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, wildlife; (7)

18	If so authorized, the project shall continue to be exempt as		
19	provided under this Act.		
20	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
