A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
2	transportation is charged with the implementation of the bridge
3	rehabilitation and replacement program for bridges with a
4	sufficiency rating of less than eighty to be designed and
5	constructed. There are currently seven hundred fifty-six state-
6	owned bridges, of which two hundred fifty-six are functionally
7	obsolete and thirty-nine are structurally deficient.
8	Functionally obsolete bridges are defined as bridges with
9	geometric deficiencies such as a bridge being too narrow.
10	Structurally deficient bridges are defined as bridges with a
11	poor assessment of the structural condition of the bridge
12	including the waterway opening adequacy.
13	There are currently thirty bridges under the department of
14	transportation that are in the design phase that are planned for
15	rehabilitation and replacement, in addition to the Hana highway
16	bridge preservation plan, which needs to move forward for

construction, that are either functionally obsolete or

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structurally deficient.

- 1 The purpose of this Act is to expedite construction 2 projects for the bridge rehabilitation and replacement program by providing temporary exemptions from certain state and county 3 4 requirements. 5 SECTION 2.     conflict with federal requirements that are a prescribed
    condition for the allocation of federal funds to the State, the
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- 1 conflicting part of this Act is inoperative solely to the extent
- 2 of the conflict and with respect to the agencies directly
- 3 affected, and this finding does not affect the operation of the
- 4 remainder of this Act in its application to the agencies
- 5 concerned. The rules under this Act shall meet federal
- 6 requirements that are a necessary condition to the receipt of
- 7 federal funds by the State.
