A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSERVATION AND RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 183, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3	to read as	s follows:

5		SANDALWOOD
6	§183·	-A Duties; sandalwood. In addition to the duties
7	listed in	section 183-1.5, the department shall:
8	(1)	Support reforestation efforts throughout the State for
9		all native sandalwood species with the objective of
10		replenishing native sandalwood species forests to the
11		level that those forests existed prior to 1800;
12	(2)	Provide incentives to local entrepreneurs to cultivate
13		native sandalwood species in plantations for either
14		reforestation programs or commercial operations;
15	(3)	Provide support for programs that ensure the
16		sustainability of commercial sandalwood operations in
17		the State; and

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1	(4) Enforce penalties against persons who violate this
2	part.
3	§183-B Destruction or harvesting of sandalwood trees. (a)
4	It shall be unlawful to destroy or harvest a tree of a native
5	sandalwood species that is determined by the department to have
6	been in existence prior to the year 1778.
7	(b) It shall be unlawful to destroy or harvest a tree of a
8	native sandalwood species not described in subsection (a)
9	without a license issued by the department.
10	(c) Any person who destroys or harvests a native
11	sandalwood species tree shall replant native sandalwood species

trees in an amount equal to the total estimated age of all trees

- 14 monitor the replanting efforts and the success rate of the
- 15 seedlings that are replanted.
- 16 (d) It shall be unlawful to export raw or unprocessed
- 17 timber of any native sandalwood species outside the State.
- 18 §183-C Fees. (a) Any person licensed pursuant to section
- 19 183-B(b) who harvests trees of a native sandalwood species for
- 20 commercial purposes shall pay to the department a fee equal to
- 21 per cent of the dollar value of the sandalwood or
- 22 sandalwood products harvested or sold.

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- All fees collected pursuant to subsection (a) shall be 1
- deposited in the treasury of the State for use by the department 2
- for forestry purposes and all such sums as may be so collected 3
- and deposited are appropriated for those purposes.
- §183-D Criminal penalties. Any person who violates 5
- section 183-B, upon conviction thereof, is guilty of a 6
- misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$ 7 or
- imprisoned not more than one year, or both. In addition to any 8
- 9 other penalty imposed under this section, a fine of up to
- 10 shall be levied for each tree illegally destroyed or
- 11 harvested under section 183-B."
- SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 12
- matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 13
- 14 begun before its effective date.
- SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012. 15
