- 10 SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 11 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 12 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 13 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 14 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 15 of this Act are severable.
- 16 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 19 provided that the amendments made to chapter 708, Hawaii Revised

- 1 Statutes, by sections 1, 2, and 3 of this Act shall take effect
- 2 on July 1, 2012.

#### Report Title:

Computer Fraud; Protective Orders; Web Designers or Developers

#### Description:

Amends computer fraud statutes to capture a broader range of crimes committed through the use of a computer, computer system, or computer network, and increases penalties for all degrees of computer fraud. Allows protective orders for harassment committed through the use of a computer, computer system, or computer network. Establishes the crime of prohibited web design within the Hawaii Penal Code prohibiting certain acts by web designers or developers.
