## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO REVIEW ITS  
POLICIES REGARDING STREET AND ROAD WIDENING, WITH REGARD TO  
THEIR IMPACT ON PEDESTRIAN SAFETY.

1 WHEREAS, in many Honolulu neighborhoods, older streets and  
2 roads are often narrow, which can impede the flow of traffic and  
3 raise safety issues; and  
4

5 WHEREAS, in an effort to improve traffic flow, the City and  
6 County of Honolulu may require a property setback in order to  
7 widen streets and roads; and  
8

9 WHEREAS, in neighborhoods with a high population of older  
10 residents, these seniors may be unable to cross the street in a  
11 timely fashion or safe manner, and wider streets in the  
12 residential areas in which they live may be more difficult for  
13 them to navigate; and  
14

15 WHEREAS, the United States Centers for Disease Control and  
16 Prevention reported in 2007 that Hawaii ranked No. 1 in  
17 pedestrian fatalities for people age 65 and over; and  
18

19 WHEREAS, of the 27 pedestrian fatalities in 2010, 10 were  
20 seniors; now, therefore,

22 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth  
23 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2012, the  
24 House of Representatives concurring, that the City and County of  
25 Honolulu is requested to review its policies regarding street  
26 and road widening, with regard to their impact on pedestrian  
27 safety; and

29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the review include information  
30 on the impact of street and road widening on pedestrian safety  
31 in neighborhoods with significant senior populations; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of Honolulu  
 2 report its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no  
 3 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular  
 4 Session of 2013; and

 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
 7 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City  
 8 and County of Honolulu and the Department of Planning and  
 9 Permitting.
