Your Committee on Energy & Environmental Protection, to which was referred H.B. No. 425, H.D. 1, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PUBLIC UTILITIES,"

begs leave to report as follows:

The purpose of this measure is to direct the Public Utilities Commission in performing its duties to consider the need for a diverse portfolio of fossil fuel resources and to maximize the efficiency of utility generation assets to mitigate supply disruptions and cost impacts on electricity ratepayers.

The Public Utilities Commission, the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, and an individual submitted testimony in support of this measure.
