
Malama Koloa testified in support.

A Byway is also a corridor that connects people, their stories and their land. In December 2011, Holo Holo Koloa Scenic Byway received a State scenic byway designation, Kaua'i's first and the fourth in the State. A Corridor Management Plan (CMP) is key to securing a national scenic byway designation and possible grant funds.
