RELATING TO HEALTH. <u>HB 2105, HD1</u> HLT, CPC, FIN (HSCR216-12) Requires insurance coverage for fertility preservation procedures for persons who are of reproductive age and are diagnosed with cancer Status that may or whose treatment may adversely affect their fertility. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB2105 HD1) RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUG. HB 1741, HD1 HLT, CPC, FIN (HSCR156-12) Requires the insurance commissioner to develop a uniform prescription drug prior authorization form no later than July 1, 2013. Establishes staggered terms for board members. Clarifies qualifications of and restrictions on navigators. Clarifies the role of the Department of Human Services in determining medicaid eligibility. Effective July 1,

2012. (HB1736 HD1)
