Amends the definitions of "the practice of nursing as a licensed practical nurse" and "the practice of nursing as a registered nurse" to include carrying out the orders of a licensed physician assistant practicing with physician supervision, and acting as an agent of the supervising physician. Effective July 1, 2050. (SB2103 HD1)

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

EEP, CPC

Sets forth technology readiness levels based upon the U.S. Department of Energy's assessment guide. Requires the director of the Hawaii Natural Energy Institute to provide the Public Utilities Commission with an analysis of the technology readiness of a renewable energy project, upon the request of the Public Utilities Commission. Requires the Public Utilities Commission to only consider projects with a

technology readiness level of above 6. (SB2438 HD1)
