HB 2047 RELATING TO INFORMATION PROTECTION. CPC/JUD Status By January 1, 2014, requires businesses to implement a comprehensive, written policy and procedure to prevent identity theft, and to designate an employee to be responsible for protecting personal information. Requires businesses to train all employees in the implementation of the policy and procedure. HB 1957, HD1 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE INFORMATION. HLT, CPC/JUD (HSCR47-12) Clarifies that persons and entities governed by the Health Insurance <u>Status</u> Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), who use or disclose individually identifiable health information that is consistent with HIPAA regulations, shall be deemed to be in compliance with Hawaii's privacy laws and rules. (HB1957 HD1) HB 2402, HD1 RELATING TO RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES. ERB, CPC/JUD (HSCR566-12) Repeals the statutory requirement that a trier of fact determine whether or not a risk is inherent to a recreational activity when **Status** determining whether a commercial provider of recreational activity is liable for a person's injuries. Effective July 1, 2112. (HB2402 HD1) RELATING TO CONTRACTS. HB 1969, HD1 ERB, CPC/JUD (HSCR199-12) Shortens the time by which subcontractors are to receive progress and **Status** final payments from contractors on government and private construction projects. Provides interest penalties for late payments. Effective July 1, 2112. (HB1969 HD1) RELATED TO MIXED MARTIAL ARTS. HB 2013, HD1 ERB, CPC Amends the definition of mixed martial arts to describe a full contact (HSCR200-12) Status sport where the objective is to physically damage the opponent. Effective July 1, 2112. (HB2013 HD1) RELATING TO DENTAL HYGIENISTS. HB 1876, HD1 HLT, CPC (HSCR151-12) Requires a dental hygienist license certificate and annual registration Status certificate to be displayed in the office in which the dental hygienist is employed or practices. (HB1876 HD1) RELATING TO HEALTH. HB 1964, HD1 HLT, CPC Limits out-of-pocket costs for cancer medications, including non-(HSCR422-12) Status generic oral chemotherapy, under health insurance plans. (HB1964 HD1) HB 1965 RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR HLT, CPC (HSCR74-12) PHARMACISTS. <u>Status</u> Clarifies the continuing education requirement for pharmacists. HB 1966, HD1 RELATING TO VACCINATIONS. HLT, CPC (HSCR348-12) Allows pharmacists, per a physician's prescription, to administer the Status 5 influenza vaccine to persons aged fourteen to seventeen; provided that the pharmacist fulfills certain training and reporting requirements. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB1966 HD1) RELATING TO PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS. HB 1883 HSG, CPC (HSCR384-12) Prevents community associations from charging more than ten per cent of the dues in arrears for community association late Status

fees under certain-circumstances.
