HB 2670	RELATING TO ENERGY.	EEP.	FIN

Establishes the negotiated partner approach pilot program for energy savings contracts, which allows agencies to forego requests for proposals and negotiate directly with qualified vendors. Requires the

pilot program to be operational from 7/1/12 to 6/30/14.

HB 2669 RELATING TO ENERGY. EEP. FIN

Status Creates an income tax credit for development and construction costs

> for qualifying biofuel production facilities. Repeals 1/1/2017. Defines "oil refinery". Clarifies that an environmental assessment is required for an action proposing the expansion of an existing oil refinery.

HB 2611 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENTS. TRN, EEP, JUD

(HSCR129-12) Permanently amend chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes to clarify

Status current exemptions for secondary actions and require that applicants

prepare environmental assessments when required.

HB 2249 RELATING TO LANDFILLS. EEP, FIN

> Requires permitted landfills to track and report the types of alternate daily covers used. Places a preference on the disposal of residual recycling waste in landfills and incinerators and requires state and

county agencies to accept such disposals.
