SB 2630 (SSCR2437) RELATING TO NOISE.

EEP, CPC

<u>Status</u>

Proposed HD1: Authorizes a liquor commission in a county with a population of over 700,000 to establish a pilot program that uses th

dBC weighting system for the purpose of community noise control.

SB 2288, SD1

RELATING TO ENERGY.

EEP, FIN

(SSCR2747) Status

Proposed HD1: Applies the renewable energy technologies tax credit on a per-property basis. Prohibits a taxpayer from claiming the renewable energy technologies income tax credit for a renewable energy system installed for a power purchase agreement with any government agency. Increases the credit for systems installed on various types of properties. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for renewable energy systems for state facilities. Applies to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2012. Effective July 1, 2030.

SB 2438, SD1 (SSCR2425) Status

RELATING TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION.

EEP, CPC

Proposed HD1: Requires the department of business, economic development, and tourism to provide, upon request by the public utilities commission, technological readiness analysis information which the public utilities commission may consider when making final

determinations on renewable energy.

SB 2746, SD1, HD1 (HSCR979-12) Status

RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES.

TRN, EEP, FIN

Codifies certain provisions of Act 290, Session Laws of Hawaii 1997, and repeals the rest. Authorizes the Department of Transportation to adopt rules for the registration of, and issuance of license plates for electric vehicles. Exempts electric vehicles from parking fees under certain conditions. Effective July 1, 2021. (SB2746 HD1)

RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLE PARKING. SB 2747, SD1, HD1 TRN, EEP, FIN Clarifies the electric vehicle parking requirement. Allows an electric (HSCR1038-12) vehicle parking space with a charging system to be located anywhere Status in the parking lot or structure. Effective January 1, 2013, imposes a warning on any person who parks an unauthorized vehicle in a space designated for electric vehicles. Effective July 1, 2030. (SB2747) HD1)SB 2873, SD1, HD1 RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENTS. TRN, EEP, JUD (HSCR978-12) Authorizes agencies to exempt certain secondary actions from the environmental impact statements law. Requires that applicants **Status** proposing certain actions identified in the environmental impact statements law prepare environmental assessments. (SB2873 HD1) RELATING TO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. ERB, EEP, FIN SB 2239, SD1, HD1 Establishes a venture accelerator funding program under the Hawaii (HSCR1080-12) Strategic Development Corporation to assist the State's technology Status
