HB 2476, HD1 (HSCR237-12) MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE

JUD, FIN

STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES.

Status

Makes appropriations for claims against the State or its officers or

employees.

HB 1672, HD1

RELATING TO TAXATION.

JUD, FIN

(HSCR645-12) Status Establishes monetary awards for whistleblowers providing information that is the basis for a Department of Taxation administrative or judicial

action for violations of tax laws. Effective January 7, 2059.

<u>HB 1695</u> (HSCR375-12) Status RELATING TO TAXATION.

JUD, FIN

JUD, FIN

Prohibits penalties for substantial understatements or misstatements and for erroneous claims for refund or credit from being added to tax underpayments on which certain other penalties are already imposed.

HB 2574, HD1 (HSCR574-12) Status RELATING TO NOTIFICATION OF CHAPTER 91 HEARINGS.

Authorizes DLIR to provide notice of hearings pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, by written notice of hearing by first class mail, rather than registered or certified mail with return receipt. Authorizes DLIR to provide notice of hearing by publication if a party's address cannot be ascertained. Effective 1/7/2059.

HB 2404, HD1 (HSCR537-12) Status RELATING TO PUBLIC INFORMATION.

JUD, FIN

Requires any board as defined under section 92-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to make its minutes available in hard copy form and by electronic posting on its website, or if it does not have a website, on the official internet website of the State of Hawaii or the official website of

the appropriate county. Effective January 7, 2059.



HB 1611, HD2 (HSCR584-12) Status

RELATING TO THE SUNSHINE LAW.

JUD, LMG, FIN

Allows multiple board members to attend the same public gatherings and community events that are not related to any matter over which the board is currently exercising its authority and meets requirements for permitted interactions. Allows multiple members to attend the same conferences and seminars if the member produces a public report and meets requirements for permitted interactions. Allows notice of board meetings to be sent to persons requesting notice by e-mail.

HB 2452, HD1

RELATING TO NOTARIES PUBLIC.

(HSCR238-12) <u>Status</u>

Clarifies the information required to be on notary seals and increases the fees for issuing an initial notary commission and renewing a notary

commission.

HB 626 (HSCR533-12)

Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII UNIFORM COLLABORATIVE

JUD, FIN

LAW ACT.

Enacts Uniform Collaborative Law Act, which authorizes disputants to enter into collaborative law participation agreements signifying interest to resolve the dispute without intervention of a tribunal (court or other third party decision maker). Requires parties to a collaborative law process to disclose information fully, candidly, and informally without formal discovery. Subject to certain exceptions, disqualifies attorneys in the collaborative process (and their law firms) from appearing before a tribunal to represent a party in a proceeding related to the

collaborative matter.

HB 2841 (HSCR530-12) RELATING TO THE UNIFORM INTERSTATE DEPOSITIONS

AND DISCOVERY ACT.

Status

Enacts the Uniform Interstate Depositions and Discovery Act.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
