HB 1726 (HSCR18-12) RELATING TO ENERGY.

EEP, FIN

Extends the repeal date of the energy systems development special fund to 2015 to match that of the environmental response, energy, and

food security tax.

HB 2259

Status

RELATING TO ENERGY.

EEP, FIN

(HSCR315-12) Status

Applies the National Fire Protection Association's Hydrogen

Technologies Code to hydrogen production, storage, use, and handling for stationary and portable applications in the State and establishes the state hydrogen permitting authority. Contains appropriation. Effective

July 1, 2012.

HB 2326

RELATING TO TAXATION.

EEP, FIN

(HSCR480-12) Status

Amends various income tax credits to provide that the basis of eligible depreciable property for state income tax purposes shall be reduced by

the amount of the tax credit claimed.

HB 2417, HD1 (HSCR523-12) RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP, FIN

<u>Status</u>

Limits the claimable tax credit to each subject tax map key number rather than each renewable energy system on a subject tax map key number. Effective January 1, 2013, and applies to tax years beginning

after December 31, 2012.

HB 2121, HD1 (HSCR592-12) Status

RELATING TO RENEWABLE ENERGY.

EEP, FIN

Prohibits state and county agencies from entering into an energy agreement or contract to install a renewable energy system with a private provider who has claimed the renewable energy technologies tax credit. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for renewable energy systems for state facilities. Effective January 1, 2013.

HB 2690, HD1 (HSCR479-12) Status

RELATING TO GEOTHERMAL RESOURCES.

EEP/WLO, FIN

Differentiates between "geothermal resources exploration" and "geothermal resources development" for purposes of mining leases and

exploration permits. Designates "geothermal resources exploration" and "geothermal resources development" as permitted uses in all state land use districts and conservation district zones. Repeals geothermal

resource subzone provisions under state land use law.

HB 2483, HD1 (HSCR314-12) Status

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENT.

EEP, FIN

Amends the Hawaii State Planning Act to include climate change adaptation priority guidelines.
