RELATING TO HEALTH. HB 2116 HLT, FIN Status 5 4 1 Appropriates funds for the provision of health care services to uninsured persons through nonprofit community health centers. Effective July 1, 2012. HB 2120 RELATING TO TAXATION. HLT, FIN <u>Status</u> Establishes specific tax rates for the sale of pipe tobacco. HB 2227 RELATING TO BIRTH CERTIFICATES. HLT, FIN Status Provides amended birth certificates for persons who have undergone a gender transition. RELATING TO HEALTH CARE COORDINATION. HB 2664 HLT, FIN Establishes a public-private partnership in a county with a population Status between 100,000 and 170,000; partnership to develop an integrated

system to deliver health care across the spectrum of care; partnership

to work at addressing the current crisis in acute care.
