<u>HB 1398</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII PUBLIC HOUSING AUTHORITY. Authorizes the Hawaii public housing authority to develop public housing projects under a partnership or development agreement with a private party; provides exemptions from chapters 103 and 103D if not prohibited by federal law or regulation; requires annual report to the legislature.	HSG, FIN
<u>HB 1794</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING. Broadens criminal trespass in the 1st degree to include a person who enters or remains unlawfully in or upon the premises of a public housing project after a reasonable request or warning to leave by housing authorities, neighborhood watch, or a police officer. Excludes an invited guest of a resident who is in the presence of the resident. Effective 1/1/13.	HSG, JUD
<u>HB 1883</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS. Prevents community associations from charging more than ten per cent of the dues in arrears for community association late fees under certain circumstances.	HSG, CPC
<u>HB 1971</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING. Lowers the income threshold relating to affordable housing from 140% to 100% of the median family income.	HSG, FIN
<u>HB 2143</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING. Provides the Hawaii Public Housing Authority resident advisory board the flexibility to submit a list of no less than three but no more than five names of nominees to fill the resident member seat on the Hawaii Public Housing Authority Board of Directors.	HSG, FIN



<u>HB 2144</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TAXATION. Requires the department of taxation to submit a report to the legislature and the Hawaii housing finance and development corporation on general excise tax exemptions for low-cost housing and affordable rental housing construction and development.	HSG, FIN
<u>HB 2158</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PLANNED COMMUNITY ASSOCIATIONS. Provides for remedies in the event of the discovery of an error in any proxy.	HSG, CPC
<u>HB 2159</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS. Provides for remedies in the event of the discovery of an error in any proxy.	HSG, CPC
<u>HB 2478</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HOUSING LOAN AND MORTGAGE PROGRAM. Increases the Hula Mae Multifamily Revenue Bond authorization amount.	HSG, FIN
<u>HB 2736</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROMOTION OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. Extends prohibition of promoting a controlled substance in, on, or near schools, school vehicles, or public parks to include public housing projects and complexes.	HSG, JUD

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.

While every effort will be made to copy, organize, and collate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed to the incorrect office, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.
