SB 2397, SD1 (SSCR2465) Status RELATING TO FIRE SPRINKLERS.

HSG, PBM, FIN

Prohibits counties from requiring installation or retrofitting of automatic fire sprinklers in new or existing one- or two-family dwelling units used only for residential purposes. Effective 1/1/2025.

SB 2769, SD2 (SSCR2742) Status RELATING TO INSURANCE.

HSG, CPC, FIN

Requires the commissioner to publish a list of homeowners insurers and homeowners insurance annual premiums on the insurance division's official website. Requires the commissioner to publish a list of motor vehicle insurers and motor vehicle insurance annual premiums on the insurance division's official website. Allows the commissioner to intervene to adjust insurance rates. Provides for written notice of disapproval and hearing requirements. (SD2)

SB 2805 (SSCR2441 RELATING TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

(SSCR2441) Status Reduces the minimum number of resident board member candidates from five to three that must be submitted by the Resident Advisory Board of the Hawaii Public Housing Authority for consideration by the

Governor for appointment to the Authority's Board of Directors.

SB 2650, SD1 (SSCR2225) Status RELATING TO PROMOTION OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

Extends prohibition of promoting a controlled substance in, on, or near schools, school vehicles, or public parks to include public housing

projects and complexes. (SD1)
