DECISION MAKING ON THE FOLLOWING MEASURE(S):

SB2306 RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE. HMS/HTH, WAM

Status and Testimony Establishes and directs a task force to coordinate and consolidate

state long-term care programs and services. Establishes the position of deputy healthcare transformation coordinator.

Appropriates funds.

SB2083 RELATING TO HEALTH. HMS/HTH, WAM

Status and Testimony Appropriates funds to the department of human services to match

the federal medicaid disproportionate share hospital allowance

allocated to the State.

SB2227 RELATING TO HEALTH. HMS/HTH, WAM

Status and Testimony Appropriates moneys to community health centers for the

provision of direct health care for the uninsured, including those who will be disenrolled from the medicaid QUEST program

pending eligibility changes in April 2012.

SB2319 RELATING TO THE HOMELESS. HMS/HTH, WAM

Status and Testimony Appropriates funds to the homeless programs office of the

department of human services and the rental housing trust fund. Appropriates funds to the department of health for substance abuse treatment, mental health support services, and clean and sober housing services and the department of human services for a homeless prevention program, rental assistance program, and

matching funds for shelter plus care grants.

SB2467

RELATING TO HOSPITALS.

HMS/HTH, WAM

Status and Testimony

Establishes the Hospital Sustainability Program into which hospital sustainability fees shall be deposited. Requires the Department of Human Services to charge and collect a provider fee on health care items or services provided by hospitals. Effective July 1, 2012, and repealed on June 30, 2013.

SB2818

Status and Testimony

RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF DEAD HUMAN BODIES.

HTH/HMS

Repeals the authority of the department of health to deliver or distribute an unclaimed dead human body to a university, hospital, or institution for medical educational and research purposes, and clarifies the responsibilities of the person who has possession, charge, or control of an unclaimed dead human body with respect to gathering and providing information to state agencies.

No testimony will be accepted.
