<u>Status</u>

RELATING TO PROSTITUTION.

Authorizes a person convicted of committing the offense of prostitution to file a motion to vacate the judgment under certain

circumstances; establishes procedures for the motion to vacate.

Effective 07/01/50. (SD1)

SB 2579, SD2 (SSCR2720) Status

RELATING TO MINORS.

Establishes a new chapter for the safe harbor of sexually exploited children. Establishes the minor victims of prostitution special fund. Grants the family court exclusive jurisdiction over any person under eighteen who is charged with certain offenses of prostitution. Amends the statute of limitations under the prostitution coercion liability act. Establishes that persons who are under eighteen and suspected of or charged with certain offenses of prostitution shall not be prosecuted, and shall be subject to the provisions of the safe harbor for sexually

exploited children chapter. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
