<u>HB 1797</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CONDITIONAL RELEASE. Requires tolling of one-year conditional release period upon filing of motion for revocation of conditional release or motion to modify conditions.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1798</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE. Requires probation officer, prior to early discharge of defendant, to report to court concerning defendant's compliance or non-compliance with terms of probation.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 2226, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR271-12)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AN AUTOMATED VICTIM NOTIFICATION SYSTEM. Establishes the crime victim notification special fund. Requires a 4% surcharge on all inmate commissary purchases, to be deposited into the fund. Requires commission revenue on inmate telephone usage to be deposited into the fund. Effective July 1, 2012. <u>HB 1775</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO USE OF FORCE BY PERSONS WITH SPECIAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR CARE, DISCIPLINE, OR SAFETY OF OTHERS. Establishes types of physical force not justifiable when used to discipline minors.	JUD

- The date and time of the hearing;
- Measure number; and
- The number of copies the Committee is requesting.
