HB 2852 Status

### RELATING TO LANDOWNER LIABILITY.

JUD

Creates a cause of action against any person who maintains a property nuisance that causes injury or damage to the person or property of

another person.

HB 1666, HD1 (HSCR126-12) Status

RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE.

TRN, JUD

Establishes mandatory minimum sentencing for negligent homicide or negligent injury involving the operation of a motor vehicle when a vulnerable highway user is involved. Amends penalties for negligent homicide in the second degree, negligent homicide in the third degree, and negligent injury in the second degree when the incident involves a

vulnerable highway user. Adds definitions.

HB 1791 (HSCR320-12)

Status 5 4 1

RELATING TO HOMICIDE.

TRN, JUD

Requires drivers' license revocations upon convictions for negligent homicide in either the first or second degree. Sets maximum periods of license revocations for convictions of manslaughter and negligent homicide in the first or second degree: Makes imprisonment of up to two years a discretionary condition of probation for manslaughter convictions. Clarifies that probation is an available sentence for

manslaughter.

HB 1928 (HSCR322-12) Status

RELATING TO TESTING FOR INTOXICANTS.

TRN, JUD

Repeals section 291E-68, Hawaii Revised Statutes, regarding refusing to submit to a breath, blood, or urine test for those arrested for the use

of intoxicants while operating a vehicle. Makes conforming amendments to section 291E-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

<u>HB 2309</u> ( <u>HSCR321-12</u> ) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PERSONAL INFORMATION. Allows the scanning and retention of personal information contained in a state identification card or driver's license for only limited purposes.	TRN, JUD
HB 1926, HD1 (HSCR267-12) Status	RELATING TO ASSAULTS AGAINST MEDICAL SERVICES PROVIDERS.  Expands the offense of assault in the second degree to include harm to any medical services provider engaged in the performance of duty. Effective July 1, 2050. (HB1926 HD1)	HLT, JUD
HB 2232, HD1 (HSCR357-12) Status	RELATING TO HEALTH.  Addresses the circumstances under which pelvic examinations may be performed by certain health care providers and medical students on anesthetized or unconscious female patients. (HB2232 HD1)	HLT, JUD
HB 2467, HD1 (HSCR344-12) Status	RELATING TO CHILD ABUSE.  Provides greater protection to children by amending the offense of promoting child abuse in the second degree to include the possession of images of any form of child pornography that involves a minor who is younger than the age of twelve, sadomasochistic abuse of a minor, or bestiality involving a minor. (HB2467 HD1)	HUS, JUD
HB 2440 Status	RELATING TO ACTIONS BY AND AGAINST THE STATE. Clarifies that section 661-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, only waives the State's sovereign immunity with respect to a claim "founded upon a statute," if the Legislature has unequivocally waived the State's immunity in a separate statute.	JUD
HB 2591, HD1 (HSCR240-12) Status	RELATING TO ACCRETED LANDS. Clarifies that land accreted after May 20, 2003, shall be public land except as otherwise provided by law. Effective January 1, 2020. (HB2591 HD1)	WLO, JUD
