HB 2584 Status

RELATING TO NOTICE OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

LAB, ERB, FIN

INSURANCE.

To allow the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations to accept the notice of employer's workers' compensation insurance from approved third party agencies in a manner and form approved by the director.

HB 2585 Status

RELATING TO UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE INTEREST

LAB, ERB, FIN

PAYMENT.

Authorizes the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations director to increase the employment and training assessment in increments of .01 per cent retroactive to January 1, 2012, for payment of interest on

federal loans for unemployment insurance benefits.

HB 2773 Status 5 4 1

RELATING TO THE WEED AND SEED PROGRAM.

LAB, JUD, FIN

Establishes the weed and seed program under the department of labor

and industrial relations. Makes appropriation.

HB 2089 Status

RELATING TO HEALTH.

LAB, ERB, FIN

Requires employers to provide a minimum amount of paid sick and safe leave to employees to be used to care for themselves or a family

member who is ill, needs medical care, or is a victim of domestic

violence, sexual assault, or stalking.

HB 2099 Status

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

LAB, ERB, FIN

Clarifies that attorney's fees may be included in costs that may be assessed against a party who brings, prosecutes, or defends a workers'

compensation claim without reasonable ground.

HB 2217 Status 5 4 1

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT VACANCIES.

LAB, FIN

Requires State agencies to fill job positions within ten years after a

vacancy; requires the automatic removal of funds for positions vacant



longer than ten years.

<u>HB 2228</u>

RELATING TO BREASTFEEDING IN THE WORKPLACE.

LAB, ERB, JUD

Status

Requires an employer with twenty or more employees to make reasonable efforts to provide a clean location for breastfeeding employees to express breast milk in privacy. Requires covered employers to post a notice pertaining to this provision in a conspicuous location. Establishes a civil fine for the failure of an employer to

provide a location or post notice.

HB 2264

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY.

LAB, FIN

Status

Sets the unemployment insurance contribution rate schedule at "schedule F" for calendar years 2012 and 2013. Retains the maximum weekly benefit rate for unemployment at 75% of the average weekly wage until 12/31/13, and returns the rate to 70% on 01/01/14. Increases the maximum contribution rate, effective 1/1/13.

HB 2579

RELATING TO INFORMATION FOR TEMPORARY DISABILITY

LAB, ERB, FIN

Status

INSURANCE CLAIMS.

Establishes a deadline for an employer to submit the Employer's Statement portion of a Temporary Disability Insurance claim form

when requested by an employee.

RELATING TO MEDICAL BENEFITS UNDER THE

LAB, ERB, FIN

<u>Status</u>

WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAW.

Amends section 386-21(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, by requiring the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations to make a decision on disputes regarding treatment plans and continued medical

services without a hearing.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
