Establishes the wildlife recovery and rehabilitation special fund to support the operations of a facility to respond to oil and fuel-related disasters affecting native wildlife in the

RELATING TO SPECIAL MANAGEMENT AREA USE PERMITS. HB 2154, HD1 (HSCR39-12) Adds a provisional exception to the Special Management Area Use

Permit requirement for development by excluding airports when necessary to comply with Federal Aviation Administration regulations.
