No. 24, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO STUDY THE ISSUE OF FRATERNITY AND SORORITY HOUSE LOCATIONS," was referred to the Committee on Higher Education, with Representatives Chang, Giugni, Thielen, Tokioka and Ward being excused.

Representative Chang, for the Committee on Water, Land, & Ocean Resources presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 962-12), recommending that H.C.R. No. 44, be referred to the Committee on Higher Education.

On motion by Representative Chong, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.C.R. No. 44, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO STUDY THE ISSUE OF FRATERNITY AND SORORITY HOUSE LOCATIONS," was referred to the Committee on Higher Education, with Representatives Chang, Giugni, Thielen, Tokioka and Ward being excused.

Representative Chang, for the Committee on Water, Land, & Ocean Resources presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 963-12), recommending that H.C.R. No. 36, be referred to the Committee on Legislative Management.

Representative Chong moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.C.R. No. 36, be referred to the Committee on Legislative Management, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support, and may I have permission to insert written comments into the Journal. Thank you."

Representative McKelvey's written remarks are as follows:

"I applaud William Aila Jr., Chairperson of the Department of Land and Natural Resources and the Division of Boating and Recreation, for the recent action that they have taken with the installation of the swim buoys fronting the area known as Canoe Beach. However, I am in full support of an audit of DOBOR. Concerns have been generated from the community about the current and future needs of our coastal waters. The communities' issues should be addressed with the DLNR to ensure the safety and education for all ocean users.

"Recently a community treasure was killed by a watercraft while setting up canoe lanes for a high school canoe race. It is unfortunate that a tragic death happened and although the swim zone buoys have been installed, I am still concerned for the safety of the ocean users. I bring in to question the initiatives that should be taken by DOBOR to educate the boaters as to what the rules and regulations are regarding the buoys. According to testimony the buoys have been missing for about seven years, therefore many people may not realize what the swim zone buoys mean. I am interested in the amount of outreach that is being given to the community relating to this matter.

"In light of the recent accidents in our oceans, I believe that an independent audit will strengthen trust and credibility, and improve relations between residents and government. With the increased use of our oceans, accidents may become more probable, however an audit may turn up many of the problem areas and make sure that the steps to manage them are more effective.

"Another area of concern is DOBOR's fiscal and accounting system which has degenerated relations with the boaters. Apparently, harbor users that are paying their monthly fees are having difficulty getting accounting from DOBOR while at the same time several DOBOR employees are being suspected of or being charged with financial malfeasance. Given the

steady increase in fees by the harbor users and complaints of diminished services, I believe it is imperative that the boaters have a clear understanding of how their fees and taxes are being spent.

"Proper management of our unique and limited natural resources are critical for our State's future. In order to protect and enhance these resources I support an audit."

Representative Manahan rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in strong support as well, with the same request as the previous speaker. Thank you."

Representative Manahan's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I am in support of H.C.R. 36 Requesting the Auditor to Conduct a Follow-up Audit of the Management of State Boating Facilities, particularly with regard to the Ala Wai Small Boat Harbor. The Department of Land and Natural Resources' Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation (DOBOR) testified that there is no need to have a follow-up audit as it is still in the process of implementing the recommendation of the 1993, 1998, and 2001 legislative audits, as well as the 2006 financial audit. DOBOR is audited annually as a part of the DLNR's financial audit.

"The DLNR's response to this Resolution is precisely why we need a follow-up audit. The numerous testimonies presented at the Water, Land and Ocean Resources Committee hearing indicate the total dissatisfaction with and the inadequacy of the management of the small boat harbors, specifically Ala Wai.

"It is a question of operations management, not just financial management, that is at the core of this Resolution. I believe that the oversight of the management of the DOBOR Division has been unsatisfactory and that such lack of oversight has allowed improper activities to be conducted. For these reasons, I believe it is imperative that there be a follow-up audit of management of State boating facilities to put in place a system of checks and balances to the extent that no one person would have the opportunity to mismanage the boating program."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.C.R. No. 36, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A FOLLOW-UP AUDIT OF THE MANAGEMENT OF STATE BOATING FACILITIES BY THE DIVISION OF BOATING AND OCEAN RECREATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES," was referred to the Committee on Legislative Management, with Representatives Chang, Giugni, Thielen, Tokioka and Ward being excused.
